8	WUEDEAC the Endered American Descus Disc Act (ADDA) of 2024 was signed
9	WHEREAS, the Federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 was signed
10	into law by President Biden on March 11, 2021, in efforts to support individuals, families, businesses, and governments imported by the Coronavirus Diseases (COV/ID 10)
11	businesses, and governments impacted by the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)
12	pandemic; and
13	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County (the County) will receive \$183.7 million in ARPA
14 15	funding, through the ARPA State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund; and
16	funding, through the ART A State and Escal riscal Recovery Fund, and
10 17	WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors adopted File No.
18	21-555: "A resolution to create a Task Force (ARPA Task Force) to review and
19	recommend funding allocations to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors for
20	monies received by the County in the Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021"; and

22	WHEREAS, of the County's \$183.7 million of ARPA aid, approximately
23	\$36,739,238, has been recommended by the ARPA Task Force for Community
24	Support, to generate projects that respond to economic harms to workers, families,
25	small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector in the County; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, in June of 2022, the Community Support Subgroup – Other Social
28	Determinants of Health recommended \$1,538,636 to engage community partners in
29	providing additional resources, services, and supports to children and their families in
30	the County based on criteria set forth by the ARPA Task Force; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, this project would provide ARPA funds to help children thrive and
33	give their families techniques to help enhance their child's development and learning
34	potential; and
35	WILLEDEAC is the face of the COVID 40 pendemia, the evaporation of evicting
36	WHEREAS, in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic, the expansion of existing
37	resources, which promote healthy development and prevent toxic stress are imperative to the overall health of children and their families, and families of children with
38	disabilities, as well as those who have been impacted by disparities in COVID-19, are at
39	increased risk of the forementioned challenges; and

WHEREAS, all of the partners that are participating in the initiative including 42 Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS), County School Districts, and Milwaukee Child 43 Protective Services, among others, are serving children and families who have 44 experienced disparities in education and health, and the goal is to ensure projects and 45 resources are acceptable, accessible, and meet their needs in a way that is relevant 46 and promotes equity; and 47 48 WHEREAS, families who will benefit from the services, resources, and programs 49 will take part in selecting the organizations that will facilitate the projects as part of a 50 "Participatory Budgeting" process, which allocates resources by involving community 51 members to share power and decision-making with government entities; and 52 53 WHEREAS, the ARPA Task Force recommended this project for funding on 54 55 June 9, 2022; and 56 WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of July 21, 2022, 57 58 recommended adoption of File No. 22-804 (vote 7-0); now, therefore, 59 BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) 60 61 hereby authorizes the early childhood and family engagement project supported by American Rescue Plan Act revenue in the amount of \$1,538,636 to the Department of 62 Health and Human Services (DHHS); and 63 64 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board authorizes DHHS, the 65 Department of Administrative Services (DAS), Corporation Counsel, Office of 66 67 Corporation Counsel, the Risk Management Division, DAS, Community Business Development Partners, DAS, the Office of the Comptroller (Comptroller), and County 68 Executive, to prepare, review, approve, and execute all contracts and other documents, 69 and take all actions required for the purpose of providing services for the early 70 childhood and family engagement project funded by \$1,538,636, beginning August 1, 71 2022, through December 31, 2026; and 72 73 74 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes the Office of Strategy, Budget, and Performance, and the Comptroller to process an administrative 75 appropriation transfer of \$1,538,636 to direct funds to DHHS for the project. 76 77 78 , 79 80 srb 07/21/2022
