Absentee Ballot Return Assistance for the November election – New GuidanceDisability Rights Wisconsin is receiving questions from disabled voters who need

assistance mailing or delivering their absentee ballots. These practices were restricted in the April and August elections because of litigation.

An August 31st court order clarified that federal law protects the right of all disabled Wisconsin voters to receive assistance from a person of their choice, **other than the voter's employer or agent of that employer or officer or agent of the voter's union** to mail or deliver their absentee ballots, or assist with any part of the voting process.

This document provides guidance on ballot return assistance for voters with disabilities and their assisters. This **replaces** DRW's guidance provided for the August election. Follow this link to view the new guidance:

New Resources on Guardianship and Voting

Disability Rights Wisconsin has new resources on the topic of *Guardianship and Voting: Preserving and Restoring the Right to Vote.* These resources explain how people under guardianship can determine if they have retained or lost the right to vote, and, if they have lost the right to vote, how to petition the court to restore their right to vote. In Wisconsin, people under guardianship retain the right to vote unless the court expressly removes that right. Wisconsin residents who have lost the right to vote due to guardianship may petition the court to restore their right to vote.

Help us get the word out to people under guardianship, guardians, families of youth in transition, and organizations who may benefit from this information.

Check your voter registration! **October 19** is the deadline to register online at https://myvote.wi.gov/ or by mail. After this date, voters must register in person in their municipal clerk's office or at their polling place.

Do you want to vote by mail? Registered voters may request an absentee ballot on My Vote Wisconsin: https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/Vote-Absentee-By-Mail If you already requested an absentee ballot, ballots are mailed around September 22nd.
