

LAKEFRONT DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY COMMISSION

REQUEST FOR REVIEW

Before submitting an application for review, please familiarize yourself with each of the following and determine whether the project you wish to propose is appropriate for Milwaukee's Lakefront. LDAC has information to assist you.

- A. Lakefront Development Advisory Commission Criteria, 3 pps.
- B. For the proposed site, determine the current laws and regulations that apply and the restrictions on land use and development in them.
 - 1. Plans. Many lakefront sites are subject to municipal and County plans. Examples are, "A Plan for Milwaukee's Lakefront", the "Plan for Phased Development of McKinley Marina, McKinley Park and Veterans Park", and the "Aquatic Plant Management Plan for McKinley and Surrounding Areas Including the Basin at Milwaukee Lakeshore State Park".
 - 2. Lakebed grant restrictions. Many lakefront lands, especially lakebed land that was filled have land use restrictions in the laws which granted the land to the County or the City
 - 3. Deed restrictions. Many parts of the lakefront were deeded to the public subject to land use restrictions. For example, in the 1930's the City deeded several parks to the County. The deeds restrict how the land may be used.
 - 4. Municipal zoning restrictions.
 - 5. The Public Trust Doctrine. An explanation of this requirement is available from LDAC

- <u>Sq Footage</u> Approximately 600sq/ft.

- <u>Current Site</u>: Vacant.

Answer: The Gold Star Families Memorial Monument honors and pays tribute to Gold Star Families who have lost a family member in service, for their sacrifice and the ultimate sacrifice made by their loved ones.

- <u>Physical Addition</u>: One monument Structure.
- Modification of Existing Structures: None
- <u>Use</u>: Place of tribute, reflection, and fellowship.
- <u>Photographs / Drawings</u>: Attached engineering schematic and photos as **Exhibit B.** The front side of the 4-panel monument contains the Gold Star Families crest and wording. The inside of the monument contains four custom panels etched with images chosen by Wisconsin Gold Star Families to reflect the local Wisconsin and Milwaukee community and heritage.

Answer: Porous pavers in a circular platform. No plant landscaping.

Answer: No parking spaces are required, now or in the future.

Answer: Cars traffic pattern (None). Pedestrian traffic (Adjacent to Oak Leaf Trail)

<u>Answer</u>: No lease or purchase is applicable. Monument and \$110,00 value would be donated to the Milwaukee War Memorial Center.

Answer: Not applicable.

Answer: Depending on the distance considered surrounding, the surrounding area is comprised of (i) vacant park grassland, the (ii) public Oak Leaf Trail walkways, (ii) public benches, (iii) War Memorial Center and parking lot, (iv) Milwaukee Art Museum, (v) General Douglas MacArthur monument, and (vi) the recent 2021 enhanced natural prairie grass area.

*Describe How Your Project Will Change Site Lines and Vistas of the Lake.

Answer: At the proposed location, the monument is unable to change the site lines or views of the lake. Because the 2021 prairie grassland initiative has generated a hill, the lake is largely no longer visible from North Lincoln Memorial Drive relative to the eastward view and proposed location of the monument. As such, the monument would be unable to change the site line of the lake.

*<u>Access to the Lake</u>: Describe how your project will affect access to the Lakefront area generally and particularly to the water's edge.

Answer: The monument would not impact access to the Lakefront area or the water's edge.

Answer: N/A, unrelated to Great Lakes History.

<u>Answer</u>: Little to no impact on open recreational space, because the current new prairie grassland initiative land is not open walkable recreational space.

Answer: Proposed location is based on:

- April 2017 "Greenprint Milwaukee Shoreline Vision Plan," attached as Exhibit C.
- Supporting the War Memorial Center's mission and mission statement as a veteran and war memorial grounds to "*Honor the Dead, Serve the Living*" of US wars and conflicts.

<u>Answer</u>: No impact on the availability of space for temporary uses. Based on recent landscape changes, site is no longer available for temporary uses.

Answer: Monument and planform would be removed, filled, and planted.

Answer: A non-revenue generating item. Expenses for build and erection are paid for at approximately \$110,000. No support being sought from any government source. Largely maintenance free. With new wild grass landscaping little to no mowing required. Proposed maintenance agreement signed and in place with Milwaukee County War Memorial Center. Multiple Milwaukee engineering, architect, and construction firms have already provided significant in-kind contributions.


<u>Answer</u>: The Woody Williams Foundation has dedicated multiple similar monuments in 40+ states, including 4 state capitol grounds, presidential libraries, and federal lands over seven years. The foundation uses two experienced granite manufacturers that have crafted and installed 70+ monuments.

Answer: No current or future public investment is required.

Specific Site Location:

<u>Flexibility</u>: Within the overall northeast "notch" of the proposed area, the monument footprint could be shifted north/south/east/west within the overall area to address any needs of the area, level grade, or wishes by related parties.

- 1) Location: The location is not necessarily locked in just one location by one measurement.
- 2) **Shape:** The shape of the porous paver footprint itself could also be adjusted to conform to any unique shape beneficial or needed.

We welcome working with the County and LDAC. There needn't be only one shape or one exact predefined location in that general area that could function.

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

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

Monument Engineering Schematic & Photos

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

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

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

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EXHIBIT C 2017 Greenprint-Milwaukee Shoreline Vision Plan Basis for Location



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1. INTRODUCTION

The War Memorial Center (WMC) in cooperation with Milwaukee County (County), the Milwaukee Art Museum (MAM), the Rotary Club of Milwaukee (Rotary) and the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) undertook the development of a vision planning effort funded by a \$75,000 grant from the Fund for Lake Michigan. The planning consulting team (planning consultant) composed of The Sigma Group, SEH, and Stormwater Solutions Engineering, with input from UWM School of Architecture & Urban Planning's James Wasley was retained to complete a Vision Plan along Lake Michigan near downtown shoreline in Milwaukee, WI. The focused shoreline project area stretches from the northern border of the planned Milwaukee Gateway Project, north through Milwaukee County Veterans' Parks to McKinley Marina. The project area is outlined in red.

Named "Greenprint-Milwaukee Shoreline Vision Plan", the intent was to formulate a plan with sustainable design elements for current and future projects along Milwaukee County's shoreline. A primary goal was to enhance circulation systems and reduce conflict among vehicles, pedestrians, bikers, and other park users with landscaping multi-use trails, and parkland features to enhance recreational and ecological uses of this prime location along the lakefront as well as to consider future opportunities for public art, memorials, monuments honoring Veterans and other civic leaders.

The significant focus of the plan was to provide recommendations for incorporating green infrastructure (GI) components to improve water quality and the ecology of the near shore land interface with Lake Michigan given the lake is a most valuable natural resource to Milwaukee, Wisconsin and the Great Lakes region. GI addresses the impacts of run-off from Lincoln Memorial Drive, WMC and
