## **BACKGROUND**

The Department is requesting approval to purchase services with the agencies listed below for the identified service and contract amounts for the time period of January 1 to December 31, 2023. The information that follows describes, by program area, the various services to be purchased and the 2023 recommended contract amounts:

# Housing Focused Shelter/Rapid Rehousing

Seven contracts for housing focused emergency shelter care and related services are recommended for continuation. Traditionally, County funding has been provided to support the agency's general emergency shelter operations. Together, these contracts assist agencies in providing emergency shelter to over 300 persons every night. The 2023 budget includes the following:

The Cathedral Center offers shelter to 65 women and families, as well as comprehensive medical services to assist residents in reaching the goal of independence.

Community Advocates meets the basic needs of 24 women and their children for food, shelter and clothing, models and teaches violence-free behaviors and options for managing conflict, encourages healthy bodies and minds and prepares women and children for their return to the community.

The Community Advocates Family Support Center Emergency Shelter Program serves 450 homeless individuals and families annually. The Center also serves as an emergency shelter for families who have become homeless for reasons such as a domestic violence crisis, evictions or over-crowding.

The Peace Center operates a 37-bed shelter with services for battered women and their children along with a 24-hour Domestic Violence Hotline.

## The Salvation Army

All residents receive housing, meals, healthcare, and case management services to end their homelessness and prevent future homelessness. Residents and case management work together to resolve conflicts, secure income, and secure appropriate permanent housing in the community.

The 2022 contract was for a partial year due to the Request for Proposals (RFP) RFP process. Therefore, additional funds are proposed to reflect a full year budget in 2023.

Wisconsin Community Services is partnering with Cardinal Capital Management to provide housing support services in the harm reduction housing model created by the Housing Division. This will fund services for individuals who are chronically homeless due to issues such as substance abuse and who have not experienced success with other housing models. The goal of this development is to decrease the use of expensive public services such as detox, emergency room visits, and police time.

Community Advocates and the Guest House of Milwaukee provide homeless case management services for individuals enrolled in Milwaukee County's Continuum of Care Rent Assistance program. Milwaukee County receives rental assistance from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). It is a HUD requirement that Milwaukee County ensures that clients receive permanent case management in Continuum of Care Rent Assistance. For 2023, Community Advocates contract will include the \$60,000 previously allocated for the Veterans caseload.

These funds assist in the effort to connect individuals and families to appropriate services. The contract is funded by \$388,162 in tax levy and \$161,838 in Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA2) funding. The additional \$70,000 is funded by ERA2 and reflects after hour coverage for increased Energy Assistance calls.

Community Advocates, Hope House, and IMPACT, Inc will continue to provide fiscal agent services to support individuals and families who are at risk of becoming category 1 homeless by providing short term rental assistance and related household services.

# Supportive Housing Case Management (formerly Chronically Homeless Case Management)

Housing Services administers case management contracts that support Milwaukee County's Plan to End Chronic Homelessness that began in July 2015. These case management contracts provide wraparound case management services for men, women, and families that experience homelessness. In 2023, Milwaukee County will internally hire for three case managers to absorb understaffed caseloads of Guest House, Salvation Army, and Whole Health Clinical Group.

The voluntary Payee Program through Hope House of Milwaukee supports the housing stability of low-income residents who need assistance managing their finances by ensuring that their rent is paid. The 2022 partial contract amount will increase to the full annual amount in 2023.

#### **HUD Case Management Grants**

Case managers will provide ongoing support and provide resources as needed such as income and employment, access to food, hygiene support, problem solving, and budgeting. They assist in establishing personal goals and completing an Individualized Service Plan, work with residents to maintain permanent housing, provide community resources to assist with security deposits, application fees, moving expenses, furniture and utilities. The 2022 partial contract amount increases to the full annual amount in 2023.
