5 A RESOLUTION

Appropriating \$614,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to establish an Onsite Health Clinic at Milwaukee County Transport Services (MCTS) for the benefit of Transit employees to help improve access to health care and achieve health equity

WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors created the American Rescue Plan Act Task Force "to review funding recommendations for the use of ARPA monies and to utilize a process that engages broad and diverse input from the community to develop non-binding recommendations to the County Board" after the United States Congress passed the Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (File No. 21-555); and

WHEREAS, the ARPA Task Force reviewed File No. HRA 22-182 at its meeting on May 12, 2022, which recommended the allocation of \$1,813,000 in ARPA funding to help establish three onsite health clinics for Milwaukee County Employees; and

WHEREAS, the ARPA Task Force reviewed materials outlining the benefits of establishing onsite health care clinics (hereto attached to this file) that had the following goals: improved employee access to health care services, enhance employee productivity, reduce lost time and absence from work, improve overall health and wellbeing, and impact medical spend; and

WHEREAS, the ARPA Task Force recommended the County Board adopt the proposal, which was later incorporated into File No. 22-592, and unanimously approved on June 23, 2022; and

WHEREAS, at its public hearing on the 2023 Budget, the County Board heard testimony from transit employees that affordable access to health care services is a critical component of the employee benefit package offered by Milwaukee Transport Services, Inc. (MTS), the quasi-governmental operator of MCTS; and

WHEREAS, establishing a fourth onsite health care clinic at a MCTS location would enhance access to health care services and provide a valuable benefit to help retain employees who keep the transit system operating on a daily basis; and

 WHEREAS, if established, Milwaukee County employees could also access the transit health care clinic and MTS employees could also access any one of the three onsite clinics for County employees; and

WHEREAS, these investments align with Milwaukee County's vision to be the Healthiest County in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Transportation and Transit, at its meeting of November 29, 2022, recommended adoption of File No. 22-1178 (vote 4-0); and

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby appropriates \$614,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) dollars to supplement the funding provided in File No. 22-592 to establish a fourth onsite health care clinic for the benefit of Milwaukee Transport Services, Inc. (MTS) employees at an appropriate transit facility location; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes the Office of Strategy, Budget and Performance, and the Office of the Comptroller to process an administrative appropriation transfer of \$614,000, to establish project and operational budgets for this approved Fiscal Health Challenge project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Department of Human Resources, the Office of Strategy, Budget and Performance, the Office of Corporation Counsel, the Department of Administrative Services, Risk Management Division; Office of Economic Inclusion, Comptroller, and County Executive, to prepare, review, approve, and execute all contracts and other documents, and take all actions as required for the purpose of administering the above-referenced Fiscal Health Challenge project funded by the American Rescue Plan Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Office of Strategy, Budget and Performance, in collaboration with the Department of Human Resources, shall provide an annual report including status updates related to the above-referenced Fiscal Health Challenge project, with annual report updates to be provided throughout the duration of the American Rescue Plan Act grant timeline; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County American Rescue Plan Act Task Force is hereby requested to review the request for ARPA funds and provide a recommendation to the County Board of Supervisors prior to final adoption of this resolution.
