9 10 11 12	WHEREAS, the Federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 was signed into law by President Biden on March 11, 2021, in efforts to support individuals, families, businesses, and governments impacted by the Coronavirus Disease pandemic; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County (the County) will receive \$183.7 million in ARPA funding, through the ARPA State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund; and
16 17 18 19 20	WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors adopted File No. 21-555: "A resolution to create a Task Force (ARPA Task Force) to review and recommend funding allocations to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors for monies received by the County in the Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021"; and
21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, of the County's \$183.7 million of ARPA aid, approximately \$36,739,238 has been recommended by the ARPA Task Force for Community Support, to generate projects that respond to economic harms to workers, families, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector in the County; and
25 26 27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, in August of 2022, the Household Assistance Community Support Subgroup recommended the Acts Homeownership Acquisition Fund project (the Fund) receive \$2,583,988 in Community Support funding, based on criteria set forth by the ARPA Task Force, and this recommendation was reaffirmed by the ARPA Task Force on a vote of 5-0 at its meeting of September 8, 2022; and
31 32 33 34	WHEREAS, Milwaukee is losing 1,000 families of color each year, and in majority Latino neighborhoods, homeownership is down 15 percent since 2010, and for majority Black neighborhoods, homeownership is down by 20 percent; and
35 36 37 38 39	WHEREAS, the primary root cause of this devastating drop in homeownership and stability of neighborhoods is predatory acquisition - the targeting of communities of color by investors to flip owner occupied homes into rental assets for outside investors; and
40 41 42 43	WHEREAS, there are over 17,000 Black and Latino families aspiring to purchase a home for \$125,000 or less; unfortunately, there are only 1,500 available homes sold each year in this price range; and
44 45 46	WHEREAS, 40 percent of this available inventory is purchased by investors; and

47 WHEREAS, to combat predatory acquisition, the Fund will acquire 100 properties 48 at approximately \$100,000 each by December 31, 2024, under Phase I of the project, 49 which reflects an estimated cost of \$11 million, including \$1 million in staff support, and 50 a \$10 million capital fund; and 51 52 WHEREAS, Phase I of the project is being financed through public and private 53 contributions, including \$1 million from the Zilber Family Foundation (ZFF) for the 54 startup staffing costs, and of the \$10 million capital fund, \$2 million has been raised 55 privately with the \$8 million balance being supported by the proposed \$2,583,988 from 56 the County's ARPA fund, a \$2.5 million pending request through the City Housing Trust 57 Fund, and the balance of \$3 million being raised privately; and 58 59 WHEREAS, after the sale to homeowners, the proceeds will be reinvested into 60 the next round of properties by the Fund, and the cycle will repeat itself in perpetuity; 61 and 62 63 WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of December 8, 2022. 64 recommended adoption of File No. 22-1121 (vote 6-0); now, therefore, 65 66 BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) 67 authorizes the Acts Homeownership Acquisition Fund project (the Fund) supported by American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) revenue in the amount of \$2,583,988, to the 68 69 Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS); and 70 71 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes DHHS to 72 develop and administer the Fund, and enter into a Purchase of Service contract with 73 Acts Community Development Corporation doing business as Acts Housing, for a total 74 amount up to \$2,500,000, for 2023 through 2024; and 75 76 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes DHHS to 77 provide contracting, fiscal oversight, and project management support for the Fund, for 78 a total amount up to \$83,988, for 2023 through 2024; and 79 80 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes the Office of 81 Strategy, Budget and Performance (OSBP), and the Office of the Comptroller 82 (Comptroller), to process an administrative appropriation transfer of \$2,583,988 to direct funds to DHHS for the Fund, starting January 1, 2023, until December 31, 2024; and 83 84 85 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board authorizes the administrating department, the Department of Administrative Services (DAS), the Office of Corporation 86 87 Counsel, Risk Management Division, DAS, Community Business Development Partners, DAS, Comptroller, OSBP, and County Executive, to prepare, review, approve, 88 89 and execute all contracts and other documents, and take all actions as required for the 90 purpose of administering the above-referenced programs funded by the ARPA grant 91 92 93 allocation framework.
