- Birth to 3 in 2022
 - Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Project
 - This is an evidence based and effective approach for increase providers and parents' capacity to support the social emotional development and well being of their children. The intention is to improve social emotional outcomes of children's Birth to 3 Program while promoting racial health equity. This pilot began June 2022.
 - Child and Family Pandemic Recovery Grant
 - Continuous work on media and outreach

The goal was to meet with other local state and city leaders to identify common challenges and strategies to support prenatal through age 3 agenda for families in our community.

CLTS/CCOP in 2022

- CLTS/CCOP sent 16 families to the Circles of Life Conference, NAMI and other conferences
- Reached 2000 enrolled children in 2022, this was our goal
- Children's Integration CLTS has been part of Multi-Disciplinary Team in Central Staffing

Children with complex cases – Multi-Disciplinary Team includes areas of Youth Justice, DMCPS, CCS, Wraparound, and CLTS.

Integration includes the Behavioral Health Services area for Resource and Referral Line and Intake screeners

- No Wrong Door Options counselor on the Resource and Referral Line trained to provide information on all children's programs.
- Home-Based Community Service ARPA Grant Awarded \$2 million



CLTS/CCOP 2023

- HCBS ARPA funds will be used for marketing, outreach, conferences, Hear WI, Healing Harmonies, Vision Forward, contracted agencies.
- CLTS continues to increase enrollment Current enrollment: 2151 children enrolled! Goal for 2023 is 2900!!!
- Community Café Every First Friday is about Children's 101. There will be other topics and dates to be announced!
- Conferences coming up: Circles of Life May 10 to May 13, Other conferences will be announced. Plan to send more families and staff this year.
- Planning to hold an event for families and providers!
- Providers in CLTS network has increased
