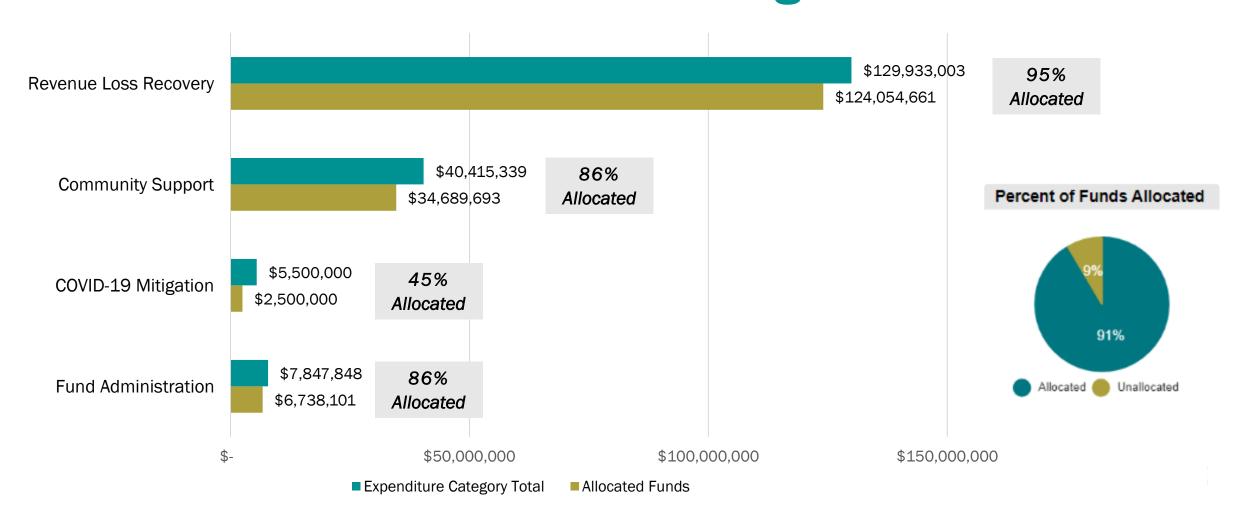

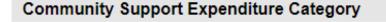

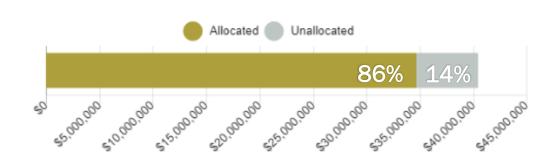

Revenue Loss Recovery Subgroup Updates:

- The Fiscal Health Challenge supported by the Revenue Loss Recovery subgroup is closed.
- Capital and planning requests should be submitted through the annual capital request process for consideration to request ARPA funds.
- Funding for the Milwaukee Transport
 Services employees to utilize three onsite
 health clinics established for Milwaukee
 County employees was approved in
 December for \$260,000.

COVID-19 Mitigation Subgroup Updates



COVID-19 Mitigation Updates

- As of January 10, 2023, the subgroup has received 28 requests for COVID-19 mitigation funds and approved \$2,575,704 in expenses.
- The County submitted a request for reimbursement to FEMA for \$746,809.50 of eligible expenses from January 1, 2022 July 2, 2022. Reimbursement would reduce the need to dedicate ARPA funding to these costs.

Fund Administration Updates

- The Subgroup is exploring the creation of a financial tracking dashboard with IMSD that provides real-time financial data from Infor for project managers and stakeholders.
- The Procurement Division of the Department of Administrative Services will release an Evaluation Request for Proposals (RFP) for Phase One of the ARPA Evaluation Plan in January 2023.
- DHHS will request fund authorization for \$896,500 in Fund Administration funds in the January 2023 board cycle. This follows the ARPA Task Force recommendation in December 2022.

Community Engagement & Strategic Partnerships

- Funding Amount: \$2,087,500
- Total Cumulative Expenditures: \$219,586.50 or 11%
- Main Activities
 - Build a sustainable model for equitable community engagement that centers on community health and resilience
 - Builds leadership, organizational, and advocacy capacity of County residents and vulnerable communities to be full and equal partners in determining and implementing strategies for COVID response and recovery.

Community Engagement & Strategic Partnerships

- Project Updates
 - 2022 was focused on Informing and Listening to residents to determine funding priorities
 - 2023 will focus on Involving and Empowering residents as the County shifts to implement funded projects
 - Community Engagement Manager in Office of Equity hired in December 2022 to lead work
 - Info & Outreach Coordinator starts January 23rd will work with project teams and coordinate community outreach activities to directly connect residents with services



Office of Strategy, Budget & Performance ARPA Accomplishments



Office of Strategy, Budget & Performance

In collaboration with DHHS, the Comptroller's Office, and other departments 91% of Milwaukee County ARPA funds have been allocated to vetted projects. Noteworthy activities include:

- Established and facilitated 4 distinct project recommendation processes for each expenditure category
- Ensured Milwaukee County followed ARPA regulations through the creation of 9
 documents that provide guidance on federal policies and requirements
- Created and facilitated 3 rounds of the Fiscal Health Challenge
- Reviewed 202 project ideas submitted across the Milwaukee County expenditure categories
- Prepared 66 presentations for ARPA-related meetings
- Submitted 6 reports to the United States Department of Treasury
- Created and maintained 4 public websites, including 3 live dashboards and 1 community engagement form
