

City on a Hill (COAH) proposes to improve the care for the top ranked need in Milwaukee County – mental health. To close gaps in mental health access, this project will leverage the engagement of COAH's collaborative network of partners to better respond to the need for mental and behavioral health provider access. COAH will add additional capacity through a unique partnership leveraging a tech-enabled kiosk approach with Nurse Disrupted and Anesis Therapy that will provide culturally responsive behavioral health services through their client facing kiosks at the COAH campus This funding will be used to hire dedicated health professionals to provide a greater level of care to these patients, will improve the care provided in the clinic setting and accelerate the healing process.	\$408,831	97.5	High Priority	100%

One would be a bilingual licensed professional counselor (LPC) who would be embedded into the youth development programming offered through Milwaukee Christian Center in the 53215 zip code and other program partners.
