9	WHEREAS, as part of the Annual Action Plan (the Plan) process, a virtual public
10	hearing was held on October 8, 2022; and
11	WILLEDEAC for 2022, a review process was established to abientively reply
12	WHEREAS, for 2023, a review process was established to objectively rank
13 14	Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) projects based on a scoring system to make final recommendations, and a panel was organized to score each competitive
14 15	project based on this system; and

17	WHEREAS, the 2023 Milwaukee County (the County) CDBG allocation totals
18	approximately \$1,637,116; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, 20 percent of the total funds can be used for administration; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, 15 percent of the total funds can be set aside for public service
23	projects; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, the allocation continues to be split between large competitive
26	projects and municipal projects; and
27	WILLEDEAS, although the municipal prejects were not accord and ranked for the
28	WHEREAS, although the municipal projects were not scored and ranked for the purpose of this report, they are included to show the complete allocation; and
29 30	purpose of this report, they are included to show the complete allocation, and
30 31	WHEREAS, projects must serve low-to-moderate income individuals within the
32	County CDBG jurisdiction, otherwise, the County cannot fund these projects per the
33	United States (U.S.) Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)
34	regulations; and

36	WHEREAS, the HOME Program was born out of the National Affordable Housing
37	Act of 1990, and was a spin-off of the CDBG Program; and
38	
39	WHEREAS, the County, as a designated Urban County, is part of a HOME
40	Consortium with the Cities of West Allis and Wauwatosa; and
41	
42	WHEREAS, approval by the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County
43 44 45	Board) of the recommendations for the 2023 HOME funding, anticipated to be \$1,388,845, is required to complete the 2023 Plan, which is submitted to U.S. HUD; and

- 46 WHEREAS, all recommended CDBG and HOME funds must be spent outside 47 the City of Milwaukee; and

WHEREAS, pending County Board approval, the 2023 Plan will be published for a required 30-day comment period, and any public comments will then be incorporated into the final 2023 plan, and submitted to the U.S. HUD for approval; and

- WHEREAS, in no case will program expenditures exceed available revenue, and
 projects will be adjusted on a percentage basis if the final award from the U.S. HUD
 differs from the County's funding amounts; and
