10	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County (the County) has among the highest rates of
11	overdose deaths in the State of Wisconsin (the State), and record numbers of
12	emergency calls related to overdoses have been seen in the last two years; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, from 2014-2020, the opioid overdose fatality rate in the County was
15	30.9 per 100,000 persons, more than twice the State rate of 14.8 per 100,000; and

17	WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board)
18	authorized the Office of Corporation Counsel (OCC) to retain outside counsel under a
19	contingency fee arrangement, and to file suit against opioid manufacturers and
20	distributors as the OCC deemed appropriate in adopted File No. 17-722; and
21	WHEREAS 2021 State Act 57 greated Section 165 12 State Statutes, relating to
22 23	WHEREAS, 2021 State Act 57 created Section 165.12, State Statutes, relating to the settlement of all or part of the Litigation; and
23 24	the settlement of an or part of the Engation, and
25	WHEREAS, Section 165.12(4)(b)2, State Statutes, provides the proceeds from
26	the Settlement Agreement must be deposited in a segregated account (the Opioid
27	Abatement Account), and may be expended only for approved uses for opioid
28	abatement, as provided in the Settlement Agreements (the Agreements); and

30	WHEREAS, on December 15, 2021, the County Board adopted File No. <u>21-1127</u> ,
31	which authorized OCC to enter into Agreements to receive funds from three Opioid
32 33	Settlement distributors; and
34	WHEREAS, the Project Management Office, Office of Strategy, Budget, and
35	Performance (OSBP) gathered input from County stakeholders, and has facilitated a
36	process to make allocation recommendations for the Opioid Settlement Funds; and

38	WHEREAS, County departments submitted proposals for projects that include
39	one-time expenses such as equipment, technology or capital items, or programmatic
40	expenses for up to three years; and
41 42	WHEREAS, applications were received from October 3, 2022, through
42 43	November 3, 2022; and

45	WHEREAS, a review panel was established to score proposals on a
46	predetermined criterion; and

48 WHEREAS, the Office of the Comptroller projects that the County will receive 49 approximately \$19.1 million in Opioid Settlement funding through 2025, based on a 50 disbursement schedule provided by advisors:
