Subject: Report from the Milwaukee Public Museum

Results for the four months ended December 31, 2022

The Mission of the Milwaukee Public Museum is to inspire curiosity, excite minds and increase desire to preserve and protect our world's natural and cultural diversity through exhibitions, educational programs, collections and research.

#### **Current State of the Museum**

Museum attendance has been exceeding our projections. When we built the budget, we projected attendance to be slightly lower than pre-pandemic attendance. Between September and December, attendance is 25% ahead of projection. In January, we exceeded projections by 33% and were ahead of 2019 actual numbers.

We continue to serve the community in various ways – onsite, offsite, and virtually. More than 2,300 students visited the museum, many of them free. Our education staff delivered virtual programs to more than 4,800 students and community members. They served more than 2,000 students as part of MPM's outreach program. And they delivered on-site programming to over 6,000 visitors. We also hosted two Science on Tap lectures (hybrid virtual/in-person). One featured a Nasa Astronaut who gave his perspectives on spending 6 months at the space station. The other was an indigenous speaker who discussed Land Rematriation and Tribal Buffalo Relocation.

Our research staff discovered and described two new species – 1 bamboo and 1 moth species. Last fall, MPM completed the first field season for the Statewide Community Science Project, a dedicated vision to educate the Wisconsin public about the state's rich biodiversity and pressing need for environmental stewardship. In the inaugural season, MPM, Harbor District, Inc., Marquette University, Cofrin Center for Biodiversity at UW-Green Bay, and the Cable Natural History Museum led community science education efforts across the state by conducting biodiversity surveys across seven sites of distinct habitats. The 2022 pilot program was highly successful in engaging the Wisconsin community; the biodiversity surveys were attended by 250+ participants from across the state of Wisconsin. Survey participants conducted hands- on learning experiences about Wisconsin biodiversity by identifying vascular plants, insects, birds, and other flora and fauna of Wisconsin. In the first year all sites and partners added over 3,000 records covering 700 species with over 4,000 identifications to a dedicated iNaturalist database <a href="https://www.inaturalist.org/projects/wisconsin-statewide-community-science">https://www.inaturalist.org/projects/wisconsin-statewide-community-science</a>

Digitizing our collections allows researchers (and the public) to access our collections online around the world

and it makes it easier for MPM to track collections during the move. More than 1.18M digitized records were downloaded by researchers between September and December 2022. MPM also digitized over 14,000 new object records across all departments and 15,847 object records were modified with additional information. Staff also inventoried approximately 50,000 library items and checked against other repositories for duplication and online access.

### **Fiscal Summary**

For the four-month period ending December 31, 2022, MPM consolidated financial statements reported an operating income of \$992,000 compared to \$1.5 million income from same period in the prior year primarily due to large one-time estate gifts received in prior year. Overall, the change in net assets was an increase of \$4 million this year vs. a \$3.5 million increase a year ago.

Consolidated operating revenue increased in this fiscal year to about \$5.1 million vs. \$4.9 million in the same period of the prior year. This increase is mainly due to the museum operating at normal operations in this current fiscal year. Through the same period in the prior year, the museum continued to operate at below-normal capacity due to the pandemic.

Consolidated operating expenditures for the fiscal year were \$4.1 million vs. \$3.5 million in the prior year. Most operating expenses increased as expected in the current fiscal year as normal operations fully returned.

In other non-operating activity, MPM and the Endowment investments reported an investment loss of \$24,000 as the market continued to be highly volatile. A distribution from the MPM Endowment Fund totaling \$66,000 was made to MPM, historically comparable to those of prior years. MPM continues to have to a fiscally conservative course of significantly reduced reliance on MPM Endowment earnings than in the decade prior.

## Capital Investment Summary County Funded Capital Projects

Major County funded projects that are currently in process or will hopefully be in process soon at the Museum include:

- Fire and police repeater/antenna dispatch system expected completion in February
- Fire panel/fire safety system replacement waiting for a battery backup

### **MPM Federally Funded Projects**

Dr. Jennifer Zaspel, VP/Academic Dean submitted an NSF grant proposal for \$3.5M to establish an ecosystem of biodiversity ambassadors through a statewide community science project.

Ms. Patty Burke started to digitize and organize the Devonian fossils. This project will also help to ready the collections for a move. Funding is provided by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (\$86,740).
