 - A. The Milwaukee County Medical Examiner's Office (MCMEO) is requesting adoption of a resolution which will create one FTE Forensic Chemist, one FTE Forensic Investigator, and one FTE Assistant Medical Examiner.
 - B. The three new positions are budgeted at approximately \$385,000 and have been calculated at positions starting in the mid-range. The position costs are offset via funding from the opioid settlement outlined in County Board file #23-114.
 - C. Funding has been identified for years 1-3, and the Medical Examiner's Office will work with the Office of Strategy, Budget and Performance to identify tax levy sources to offset the costs of the positions as soon as feasible.
 - D. The fiscal note assumes the positions will be hired in the mid-range of the salary by pay period 6.
