# REQUEST

Requesting recommendation of the following expense for American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding consideration totaling \$500,000.

### POLICY

Milwaukee County Board file 21-555: "A resolution to create a Task Force to review and recommend funding allocations to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors for monies received by the County in the Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021"

### BACKGROUND

Milwaukee County received \$183 million between 2021-24 in federal ARPA aid. These funds are intended to allow flexibility for jurisdictions to meet local needs and fund local solutions to support families, small businesses, impacted industries, essential workers and the communities disproportionately affected by the pandemic.




### Project Name: Milwaukee Premium Assistance Program Pilot

#### **Overview of the project:**

The Milwaukee Premium Assistance Program (MPAP) is a collective two-year pilot that aims to provide assistance in paying health insurance premiums for low-income Milwaukee County residents eligible for Marketplace insurance plans, in order to improve health care access and health outcomes. This program would be the result of partnership between government, health care, health insurance, and non-profit agencies to invest in prevention for the county's most vulnerable residents. The program's current design targets Milwaukee County residents with income between 101 and 138 percent of the Federal Poverty Line (FPL).

The total cost of the model is estimated to be about \$3.5M total over two years, and the County ARPA funding requested would subsidize part of the program, with other also entities contributing to cover the cost. The MPAP Program Administrator will be Community Advocates, and the non-profit's role will be to verify eligibility and make payments directly to the health insurance company on behalf of the resident.





The Milwaukee Health Care Partnership (MHCP) is a public/private consortium dedicated to improving health care for low-income, underserved populations in Milwaukee County. The organization has been leading the design, feasibility analysis, and fundraising for the project. The County would be one of the funding partners. If fundraising for the Milwaukee Premium Assistance Program is successful, the program would begin operating in summer of 2023. The MPAP plans to reach target residents will through marketing, as well as through outreach by an established group of enrollment assisters, health insurance agents and brokers that work with vulnerable populations.
