
### Who Participates in SNAP?

The **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)** provides food assistance for low-income individuals and households. Eligibility for SNAP and benefit levels are determined by a number of factors, including household size, income, and available resources. SNAP is available to everyone who applies and meets the eligibility requirements set by their State.


In fiscal year (FY) 2020\*, 585,387 people in 304,310 households received SNAP benefits in Wisconsin (WI). The average monthly benefit was \$104 per person.

73% of WI households receiving SNAP in FY 2020 had income at or below the poverty line.

30% of WI households receiving SNAP in FY 2020 had income from wages or work.




#### Not all who qualify for SNAP receive it.

## What is SNAP's Economic Impact?

An average of \$61 million in SNAP benefits were issued each month in WI in FY 2020. SNAP benefits are spent on food, so they support farmers, processors, distributors, and retailers. Approximately 4,247 food retailers accept SNAP benefits in WI.

During economic downturns, every \$1 in new SNAP benefits issued can increase gross domestic product by \$1.54.
