REQUEST

Authorization to accept funding from the Harley Davidson Foundation in the amount of \$350,000 including a 10-year commitment to park maintenance to benefit Highland Park in exchange for issuing naming rights and renaming "Highland Park" to "Harley Park".

Milwaukee County Parks owns and maintains Highland Park (3800 W Highland Blvd, Milwaukee, WI) which is outlined in the image below. Highland Park is a small (3.4 acre) park containing a forested hillside, walking path, and formerly a play structure. Parks has collaborated with community groups and neighboring institutions Miller Coors and Harley Davidson to plan for future improvements to the park. In the 2021 Capital Budget, Parks was awarded Capital Project WP072801 which funded the removal of a derelict playground in the park and allocated funding for future improvements to the site. Since that time, Harley Davidson through its non-profit foundation the Harley Davidson Foundation ("HDF") has publicly announced plans for "The Hub" a redevelopment of their existing surface parking lots to a community-oriented park that is immediately adjacent to Highland Park. The Hub is located east of N 38th Street between W Juneau and W Highland in the image below.



HDF has offered to fund improvements to Highland Park and commit to maintaining the park for a 10-year period in exchange for Milwaukee County granting naming rights. The request is to rename "Highland Park" to "Harley Park" to acknowledge a gift of \$250,000 in capital improvements and \$100,000 for maintenance for \$350,000 in total over this 10-year period (2023-2033).

Milwaukee County Parks has conducted initial planning of the park to determine what capital improvements would be appropriate for a park of this size and in this service area. Further design is needed but the initial scope of improvements would be to improve what is already there including a cleanup of the forested area, invasive species removal, construction of a shade structure such as a picnic shelter for community gathering, and improvements to pathways and lighting. The design of park improvements will be coordinated with HDF so that there is consistency to the overall park including Harley's Hub. The play structure that was removed from Highland Park will be replaced with play structures in the Hub, any and all improvements on land owned by Harley will be their responsibility and in no part of this proposal would Milwaukee County commit to improving or maintaining Harley property.

Under the terms of this proposal, the newly renamed Harley Park would remain public land that is owned and controlled by Milwaukee County as it is today.

HDF would make payments to the Milwaukee Parks Foundation who would be able to hold and disburse funds over the 10-year maintenance period and also disburse funds for capital improvements based upon the existing agreement between the County and the Foundation.

Parks is recommending approval of this item so that the funds allocated in the existing capital project (\$146,447) can leverage an additional \$350,000 from HDF and the

burden of maintaining the park will be relieved by HDF for a 10-year period.

FISCAL EFFECT

This proposal would increase capital funding by \$250,000 and operating funding by \$10,000 per year for a 10-year period totaling a \$100,000 benefit to the Parks' operating budget.
