A RESOLUTION

Requesting a research and analysis plan and initial baseline report about the operation of the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility (CJF) to establish a foundation of understanding to inform future policy decisions and studies, to promote well-informed, thoughtful, and respectful engagement, and to balance transparency and accountability with the need to manage legal risks and legal privileges.

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County is responsible for the safety and well-being of all persons in its care at county operated correctional facilities, such as the Criminal Justice Facility (CJF or Jail or facility), as may be required by Wisconsin State Statutes, the Wisconsin Department of Corrections (DOC), local ordinances, and court orders (such as the Christensen Consent Decree); and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County adopted File No. 19-192, and later approved a five-year, \$109.2 million contract extension (File No. 20-877), to contract with Wellpath, LLC for medical, dental, and mental health services, which includes 24 hours a day, 365 days a year mental health services, access to on-call psychiatric services, an onsite psychiatrist, wellness coordinators for high acuity and vulnerable residents, restricted staff substitutions and more; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County approved an extension of its medical monitoring contract with National Commission on Correctional Health Care Resources, Inc. (NRI) through March 31, 2024, which amongst other responsibilities, calls for three entities (Lead Monitor, Medical Monitor, and Mental Health Monitor) from NRI to perform bimonthly visits and provide monthly reports to the County (File No. 19-196); and

WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors approves the budget for the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office and in that capacity, also has oversight responsibilities as limited by law regarding the CJF, which necessitates access to timely information to inform policy and decision making, with the acknowledgement and understanding that the Sheriff is entitled to significant autonomy and discretion by the Wisconsin Constitution, state statutes, and case law in administering the Jail and carrying out law enforcement functions; and

WHEREAS, considering the desired timeline to inform policy and decision making, a performance audit by the Audit Services Division-Office of the Comptroller

may not be the best format to obtain information due to required compliance with standards for performing an audit and the time necessary to complete such reporting, which would likely require at least a year, if not more; and

WHEREAS, any findings resulting from this or subsequent studies must maintain the confidentiality of personal health information and any applicable legal privileges; and

WHEREAS, there is always the potential for civil litigation relating to events, including but not limited to deaths, occurring in the Criminal Justice Facility and any future study of operational policies and practices must be sensitive to ongoing litigation and/or investigations, whether internal or by third-party investigators; and

WHEREAS, any research or publication of information for the purpose of guiding policy decisions as it relates to the loss of life of persons in our care needs to be handled with sensitivity and reverence to the trauma and pain in-custody deaths cause the community and especially the families and friends of loved ones who have died, and consciously attempt to not retraumatize or exploit these deaths, the families and friends of those that passed, or the community; and

WHEREAS, due to the sensitive and complex nature involved in the operation and management of the CJF, any studies evaluating current practices, policies and procedures will require thoughtful coordination to collect information from all parties involved while addressing the above concerns and better enabling the County Board of Supervisors to perform their budgetary and related oversight responsibilities, as limited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Judiciary, Law Enforcement, and General Services, at its meeting of May 8, 2023, recommended adoption of File No. 23-554 (vote 5-0); and

 BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office is hereby requested to provide the following research plans and reports as detailed herein by no later than the July 2023 cycle, as coordinated and guided by the Office of Corporation Counsel due to legal privileges and confidentiality necessities, with support from the Department of Strategy, Budget and Performance – Project Management Division, and in coordination with relevant vendors and other County departments, as identified and requested by the Office of Corporation Counsel; and
