REQUEST

Per Milwaukee County Adopted 2023 Budget, the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) will provide a report to the County Board with information on the Paratransit Taxi service's new or extended contract details. The report shall also include an update on Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirements and completed engagement activities with impacted communities.

POLICY

Per Milwaukee County Adopted 2023 Budget, MCTS will provide a report to the County Board with information on the new or extended same day ride contract details. The report shall also include an update on Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirements and completed engagement activities with impacted communities.

BACKGROUND

The MCTS Paratransit Taxi (Taxi) contract with American United Transportation (AUT) provides for same-day transportation options for ambulatory paratransit clients. This service, which is above and beyond the federally mandated requirement of complementary paratransit services, started out as a cost-effective and convenient program to supplement the paratransit van service. However, it is antiquated in that the provider does not have wheelchair accessible vehicles available for this meter-based service. The Taxi contract was extended 120 days and is now due to expire on September 28, 2023.

The Paratransit Taxi Task Force was developed to ensure collaborative approach for exploring alternative service models that would effectively and equitably meet the on-going transportation needs. In April, representatives from MCDOT, MCTS, Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), and the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) met along with several members of the community, both taxi riders and advocacy groups for the first Paratransit Taxi Task Force (Task Force) meeting. In addition to gaining community feedback on the desired characteristics for continued same day rides, general information was provided regarding the expiration of the current taxi contract, FTA compliance and the potential for budgetary constraints if requests for additional funding do not come to fruition. In addition to the Task Force meetings, MCTS, MCDOT and DHHS have been working collaboratively to identify options (and barriers) to continue to provide equitable same-day service, in accordance with characteristics expressed by Task Force members. Below are some of the key take-aways from these discussions.

- The community would like to see same day ride program continue with similar features as today (low cost, same day ride, private ride, etc.) as well as enhancements (ability to makes stops along the way, service into other counties, appointment-based trips, etc.)
- The funding outlook is likely to hamper the County's ability to continue with a program that meets all of the desired elements
- The service will be considerably more expensive than today's model
- County and MCTS staff would begin work towards developing an RFP and costing out various service options

Additional work is underway

- MCTS and DHHS staff are researching existing RFPs used elsewhere around the country that would meet the desired service characteristics.
- MCDOT and DHHS are refining a plan for how this program will be administered and confirming the funding availability
