- A. Approval of this resolution will provide a total of \$1,653,769 \$5,106,375 in supplemental Opioid Settlement Funds for three four proposed projects for Fiscal Years 2023-2025. The projects will address the opioid crisis across Milwaukee County through treatment, harm reduction, prevention and other strategies. The estimated impact by fiscal year is \$407,332 \$481,995 in 2023, \$623,517 \$2,289,637 in 2024, and \$622,920 \$2,321,342 in 2025.
- B. Approval of this resolution would allocate \$1,653,769 \$5,106,375 of Milwaukee's Opioid Settlement Award of \$102 million. The award of a second settlement has provided Milwaukee County with a one-time opportunity to provide additional funds to the currently funded projects. Milwaukee County expects to receive an average of \$5.67 million per year for 18 years. The first 15 projects have an estimated annual spend of \$3.7-\$3.9 million. Therefore, the total amount recommended for funding through the Supplemental Funding Request did not exceed \$5.71 million (\$1.77+\$1.97+\$1.97 million) for 2023-2025 (see Table A below).

- C. Approved County Board Resolution <u>21-1127</u> called for the establishment of a segregated Opioid Abatement Account that is not part of the general fund. Costs for these three projects are anticipated to be incurred effective September 2023 through December 31, 2025. Any unused funds that remain at the end of the year will be carried over to the new year.
- D. No assumptions or interpretations were made when preparing this fiscal note. The County has been provided a payment schedule by the settlement representative (below). The Office of the Comptroller projects the County will receive up to \$35 million in payments through 2025.
