2a: Identify health disparities caused by climate change and prioritize actions that will positively impact health outcomes.





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


Climate Vulnerability Assessment

Community Vulnerability

- Under 'high' emissions scenario, Milwaukee
 County climate may be like Saint Louis' by 2100.
- With climate change, county residents & businesses may increasingly face:
 - Heat waves
 - Flooding
 - Poor air quality
- Disproportionate impacts on communities w/ high social vulnerability.



Infrastructure Vulnerability

- Air Quality & Heat Waves: Greatest impacts on county properties w/ high % of impermeable surface and limited/no trees or open space.
- Flooding: Kletszch Park and Lincoln Park may be at elevated risk of flooding during 100-year & 500-year storms.
- Increasing resilience to climate change is necessary regardless of County's emissions.



Emissions Assessment

- Evaluated emissions under Milwaukee County's control.
- Generally confirmed previous emissions inventories, w/ some minor improvements.
- Provided tool for forecasting future emissions.




