10 11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, as part of the annual Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) process, all applicants were invited to attend a public hearing and present their proposals to the Economic and Community Development Committee on March 5, 2012; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, for 2012 funds, a new review process was put in place by staff to objectively rank projects based on a scoring system to make final recommendations and a panel was arranged to score each project based on this system; and
19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, once the County Board approves the projects, the 2012 Annual Plan will be published for comment for 30-days, as required, then any public comments will be incorporated into the final 2012 Annual Plan and the Plan will then be submitted to Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for approval; and
24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, the 2012 Milwaukee County CDBG allocation totals \$1,267,877 with twenty-percent of these funds to be used for administration and fair housing (\$253,575) and fifteen-percent of the funds to be set aside for public service projects (\$190,181); and
29 30 31	WHEREAS, the allocation continues to be split between at large competitive projects and municipal projects; and
32 33 34	WHEREAS, although the municipal projects were not scored and ranked for the purpose of this report, they are included to show the complete allocation; and
35 36 37 38 39	WHEREAS, if projects are not able to provide specific documentation that they are serving the Milwaukee County CDBG jurisdiction and that they are serving low-to-moderate income individuals, Milwaukee County will not be able to provide reimbursement per HUD regulations; and
40 41 42 43	WHEREAS, an estimated \$1,267,877 will be provided in 2012 (representing a reduction of \$126,360 when compared to the 2012 Milwaukee County Adopted Budget of \$1,394,237); and

WHEREAS, in no case will program expenditures exceed available revenue; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the County Board of Supervisors authorize the Director, DHHS, or his designee, to allocate the anticipated 2012 Community Development Block Grant funds to the projects listed below and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee's recommendations (shown below) are changed as follows: add a new project for County-wide Projects for Milwaukee County Housing in the amount of \$44,964 to develop Special Needs Housing consistent with HUD requirements and previous plans adopted by the County Board; the Suburban Set-Aside Projects for Non-Public Service is reduced by \$44,964 to \$412,059 and the department is directed to adjust the amount for the County and each participating suburb using the policies approved by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Council (ICC) to be consistent with the existing agreements which require that the County and suburbs each approve the allocation of 50% of the CDBG funds available.
