A. The County Board is being requested to authorize, by resolution, a transfer from available 2011 surplus to the Debt Service Reserve a total of \$5.0 million. The surplus for 2011 is estimated to be \$11.5 million. If this transfer is not made, the surplus for 2011 would be applied against the 2013 budget, as an offset to tax levy needs. The County does not have the ability, at present, to maintain the surplus in a reserve to offset unexpected operating or capital deficits. The County uses the transfer to the Debt Service Reserve to provide a reserve for 2012 operations for unexpected costs or shortfalls in revenues. In the event of a surplus, State Statute 59.60 (5)(g) and County Ordinance 32.91 (4)(a)(3) allow the County to transfer surplus funds into a Debt Service Reserve. The transfer must have the approval of 2/3 of the voting members of the County Board.

B. The Debt Service Reserve as of the end of 2011 has a balance of \$4,266,000. The 2012 budget will be using \$1,738,000 of the Debt Service Reserve for debt interest payments, which will reduce the available balance to \$2,528,000. The projected surplus for 2011 is expected to be \$11.5 million. The resolution requests that \$5.0 million of the 2011 surplus be transferred to the Debt Service Reserve. This would increase the available Debt Service Reserve balance from \$2.5 million to \$7.5 million. The County's projection of results for 2012 is showing a projected deficit of \$0.5 million, which includes a contingency reserve offset of \$1.5 million. By transferring the funds into the Debt Service Reserve, this make the funds available to 2012. This, however, will reduce the surplus made available to the 2013 budget from \$11.5 million to \$6.5 million.

- C. The transfer fo \$5.0 million of 2011 surplus funds to the Debt Service Reserve will provide additional contingency funds of \$5.0 million for 2012. This however will reduce the funds available to offset the budget for 2013 by \$5.0 million from \$11.5 million to \$6.5 million. If however, the debt service reserve funds remain untouched for 2012 needs, the funds could be used for 2013 budget purposes.
- D. The estimated surplus for 2011 of \$11.5 million is based on a preliminary analysis of the County's activity for 2011. The County is still in the midst of an audit for 2011, and final figures will not be known, until early July. The results for 2011, while preliminary, will still provide for sufficient funds to transfer to the Debt Service Reserve. If any major changes are made to the fiscal results for 2011, the Board and County Executive will be immediately notified.
