5 6 7 8	Urging the State of Wisconsin to Adopt Senate Joint Resolution 4 to require that the revenues generated by the state transportation system be deposited into a transportation fund and requiring the legislature to create such a fund and a department of transportation

10 11	WHEREAS, Wisconsin's transportation infrastructure is a fundamental component of its ability to attract and retain business and produce jobs; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS, gas tax and vehicle registration fees comprise over 85% of the state's segregated transportation account although revenues from these two fees have been declining and are insufficient to meet the transportation needs in this state; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, Wisconsin's past practice of replacing the dollars transferred from the state's segregated transportation fund with general obligation (GO) bonds in the undesirable position of bonding to fund ongoing operations; and
18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, the debt service for these bonds is being paid out of the state's general fund which hinders its ability to fund other programs like Shared Revenue, Youth Aids, Community Aids and Circuit Court Operations which greatly impact Milwaukee County; and
22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, fifty-three counties in the fall of 2010 placed an advisory referendum on the ballot asking "Should the Wisconsin Constitution be amended to prohibit any further transfers or lapses from the segregated transportation fund?", with more than 70% of the voters across the state voting in support; and
26 27 28	WHEREAS, if the legislation is approved for a second consecutive session of the Legislature, Wisconsin voters would have an opportunity to vote in 2014 on this proposed constitutional amendment; and
29 30 31 32	WHEREAS, Senate Joint Resolution 4 would amend the Wisconsin State Constitution, subject to voter approval, to require that the revenues generated by the state transportation system be deposited into a transportation fund and require the legislature to create such a fund and a department of transportation; and
33 34 35	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County relies on funding from the segregated transportation fund for public transit assistance, highway maintenance, expressway patrols and other critical transportation funding needs; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby supports the passage of 2013 Senate Joint Resolution 4 to require that the revenues generated by the state transportation system be deposited into a transportation fund and requiring the legislature to create such a fund and a department of transportation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Director of Intergovernmental Relations is
authorized and directed to communicate the contents of this resolution to State
policymakers and others to help ensure its passage.
