4 5 6 7	A RESOLUTION in support of Assembly Bill 53 and Senate Bill 38 requiring the state to take action to qualify for enhanced Medicaid funding
8	WHEREAS the Detient Destantion and Affendable Come Act (ACA) and since limb
9 10	WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) was signed into law in 2010; and
11	in 2010, and
12	WHEREAS, the ACA pursued reforms to the country's health care system that would
13	result in: stronger consumer rights and protections, more affordable coverage, better access to
14	care, and stronger Medicare; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, while implementation of the ACA was challenged in the courts, the majority
17 18	of the law was upheld by the United States Supreme Court; and
10	WHEREAS, the ACA sought to require states to expand Medicaid eligibility up to at
20	least 133 percent of the Federal Poverty Line (FPL) for all U.S. residents, but the Supreme Court
21	struck down this requirement, and instead made the expansion a choice for states; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker announced his intention to turn down
24	new federal dollars for the State's Medicaid program in his 2013-2015 Recommended State
25	Biennial Budget; and
26 27	WHEREAS, the governor's proposal would result in an estimated 88,000 adults who
28	currently qualify for BadgerCare to be dropped; and
29	currently quality for Dauger cure to be dropped, and
30	WHEREAS, in 2014, thousands of Wisconsin's Medicaid recipients will be placed in
31	private health insurance exchanges and required to pay premiums; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, the transition from Medicaid to private insurance and the premium cost
34	could result in the loss of health care due to confusion and inability to pay; and
35 36	WHEREAS, in April 2013, the Milwaukee County Board voted to receive and place on
30 37	file a report (File No. 13-365) by the Community Advocates Public Policy Institute, titled, <i>The</i>
38	Impact of the Affordable Care Act on Milwaukee County's Behavioral Health Division, which
39	detailed the many ways in which the Behavioral Health Division (BHD) could utilize the ACA to
40	increase Medicaid revenue; and
41	
42	WHEREAS, being underinsured and uninsured impacts local health and human service
43 44 45	departments, including BHD, because it can lead to untreated mental health or substance abuse and lack of preventative health care; and

46 WHEREAS, Wisconsin Assembly Bill 53, and its companion, Senate Bill 38, require the 47 state to take action to qualify for enhanced Medicaid funding; now, therefore,

- BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby supports
  State Assembly Bill 53 and Senate Bill 38, and urges state officials to accept enhanced federal
  Medicaid funding to improve the State's BadgerCare program; and
