



Wisconsin Nutrition Education Program – 2012 Summary

The Wisconsin Nutrition Education Program (WNEP) is the **largest community based nutrition education program** in Milwaukee County. By utilizing nearly **\$700,000 in federal funds**, it provides essential education to over **5,000 participants** each year.

The two primary programs within WNEP, the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – Education (SNAP-Ed), provide **limited resource families and individuals** with not only the opportunity to learn about nutrition, but also the tools to apply their new skills and knowledge in their everyday life.

Our sessions are conducted in a **hands-on and interactive style** in a **learner-centered environment**. Topics include healthy eating, physical activity, food safety, meal planning and budgeting. Classes are available in **English, Spanish and Hmong** at **no cost** to eligible audiences.
