15	WHEREAS, 515,000 Wisconsin residents have motorcycle licenses or permits,
16	and more than 390,000 motorcycles are registered in the state; and

18	WHEREAS, due to the nature of motorcycle design, riders are vulnerable to
19	serious injury or death when involved in a traffic accident; and

21	WHEREAS, motorcycle safety awareness campaigns have been effective at
22	reducing motorcycle fatalities, as evidenced by a twenty-eight percent decrease of
23	motorcycle fatalities between 2012 and 2013 in Wisconsin; and
24	MULTIPLAS on October 15, 2012, the City of Milwaykee Common Council

42	motorcyclists are especially encouraged during this time to wear helmets and other
43	protective gear, never drink and ride, be properly licensed, get training, and all motorists
