11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, as part of the annual plan process, a public hearing was held at the Economic and Community Development Committee on September 12, 2014; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, for 2015, a review process was put in place by staff to objectively rank Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) projects based on a scoring system to make final recommendations and a panel was arranged to score each project based on this system; and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, the 2015 Milwaukee County CDBG allocation totals approximately \$1,394,806; and
23	WHEREAS, 20% of the total funds can be used for administration; and
24 25 26	WHEREAS, 15% of the total funds can be set aside for public service projects; and
27 28 29	WHEREAS, the allocation continues to be split between at large competitive projects and municipal projects; and
30 31 32	WHEREAS, although the municipal projects were not scored and ranked for the purpose of this report, they are included to show the complete allocation; and
33 34 35 36 37 38	WHEREAS, if projects are not able to provide specific documentation that they are serving the Milwaukee County CDBG jurisdiction and that they are serving low-to-moderate income individuals, Milwaukee County will not be able to provide reimbursement per United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations; and
39 40 41	WHEREAS, the HOME program was born out of the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990 and was a spin-off of the CDBG Program; and
42 43 44 45	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County, as a designated Urban County, is part of a HOME Consortium with the Cities of West Allis and Wauwatosa; and

 WHEREAS, Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) approval of the recommendations for the 2015 HOME funding, anticipated to be \$930,406 in HUD revenue and \$356,671 in program income for a total of \$1,287,077, is required to complete the 2015 Annual Action Plan, which is submitted to HUD; and

WHEREAS, the Wauwatosa and West Allis Consortium member shares are set aside based on their "hold harmless" amounts of 5.6% and 22.8%, respectively; and

WHEREAS, all recommended CDBG and HOME projects fit the priorities and objectives of the five-year Milwaukee County Consolidated Plan; and

WHEREAS, all Milwaukee County CDBG and HOME funds must be spent outside the City of Milwaukee; and

WHEREAS, once the County Board approves the projects, the 2015 Annual Plan will be published for comment for 30 days, as required, then any public comments will be incorporated into the final 2015 Annual Plan and it will then be submitted to HUD for approval; and

WHEREAS, in no case will program expenditures exceed available revenue; and

WHEREAS, projects will be adjusted on a percentage basis if the final award from HUD differs from the County's funding amounts; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director, Department of Health and Human Services, or his designee, to allocate the total anticipated 2015 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME funds to the following projects:
