SERVICES AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

MILWAUKEE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION AND CULTURE AND

STUDENT CONSERVATION ASSOCIATION

This services agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective March 1, 2015, by and between the MILWAUKEE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION AND CULTURE (the "County") and STUDENT CONSERVATION ASSOCIATION ("Contractor"), with local headquarters at 2342 N. 27th St., Milwaukee, WI 53210, as represented by: August Marie Ball, (414) 322-8482. Referenced together, the County and the Contractor are the "Parties" to this Agreement.

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

- (a) Contractor shall specifically perform all of the tasks set forth in the Project Summary, attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- (b) Services to be performed and activities related to these services may be changed, enhanced, or deleted from time to time throughout the term of this Agreement upon mutual agreement between the Parties.
- (c) These services are provided pursuant to Grant Number 00E01436, issued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (the "EPA") and governed by that certain Grant Agreement between the EPA and the County dated February 12, 2015 (the "Underlying Agreement").

2. **STAFFING**:

Contractor shall provide, at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this Agreement. Such personnel shall not be employees of, or have any other contractual relationships with, the County. Contractor shall also provide pertinent experience in outreach and education techniques and any necessary certifications earned.

3. <u>TERM</u>:

This term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and terminate on April 30, 2017. The Parks Director or designee will negotiate hours and dates of services to be provided throughout the term of the Agreement.

4. **COMPENSATION**:

Contractor shall be paid an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Sixty-One Thousand Four Hundred Fourteen Dollars (\$261,414) as allotted by grant funds paid pursuant to the Underlying Agreement. The compensation set forth in this Section 4 shall be the sole amount payable to Contractor by County during the term. Contractor shall submit invoices on a monthly basis for services rendered for the previous month. Contractor shall further provide, either by its own

means or through its beneficiaries or donors, Two Hundred Five Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Four Dollars (\$205,684) in cost-sharing funds toward its performance of the tasks set forth on Exhibit A.

5. OWNERSHIP OF DATA:

- (a) Upon completion of the work or upon termination of the Agreement, it is understood that all completed or partially completed data, drawings, records, computation, survey information, and all other material that the Contractor has collected or prepared in carrying out this Agreement shall be provided to and become the exclusive property of County. Therefore, any reports, information and data, given to, prepared or assembled by the Contractor under this Agreement shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the Contractor without the prior written approval of County.
- (b) No reports or documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the Contractor.

6. BUSINESS PERMITS, CERTIFICATES, LICENSES:

Contractor acknowledges that it has complied with all federal, state, and local laws requiring business permits, certificates, and licenses required to carry out the services to be performed under this Agreement.

7. **REPRESENTATIONS**:

Contractor represents that it will perform its services under this Agreement in conformance with the care and skill ordinarily exercised by reputable members of the professional community practicing under similar conditions at the same time and in the same or similar locality.

8. AUDIT AND INSPECTION OF RECORDS:

Pursuant to Milwaukee County ordinance section 56.30(6)(e), Contractor shall allow Milwaukee County, the Milwaukee County Department of Audit, or any other party Milwaukee County may name, when and as they demand, to audit, examine and make copies of records in any form and format, meaning any medium on which written, drawn, printed, spoken, visual or electromagnetic information is recorded or preserved, regardless of physical form or characteristics, which has been created or is being kept by the Contractor, including not limited to, handwritten, typed or printed pages, maps, charts, photographs, films, recordings, tapes (including computer tapes), computer files, computer printouts and optical disks, and excerpts or transcripts from any such records or other information directly relating to matters under this Agreement, all at no cost to Milwaukee County. Any subcontracting by the Contractor in performing the duties described under this Agreement shall subject the subcontractor and/or associates to the same audit terms and conditions as the Contractor. The Contractor (or any subcontractor) shall maintain and make available to Milwaukee County the aforementioned audit information for no less than three (3) years after the conclusion of each Agreement term.

9. INDEMNIFICATION:

The Contractor agrees to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify, defend and hold harmless, the County, and its agents, officers and employees, from and against all loss or expense including costs and attorney's fees by reason of liability for damages including suits at law or in

equity, caused by any wrongful, intentional, or negligent act or omissions of the Contractor, its agents or employees which may arise out of or are connected with the activities covered by this Agreement. Contractor shall, at its own expense, investigate all claims and demands, attend to their settlement or disposition, defend all actions based thereon and pay all charges of attorneys and other costs and expenses arising from any such injury, damage or loss, claim, demand or action.

10. INSURANCE:

Contractor agrees to evidence and maintain proof of financial responsibility to cover costs as may arise from claims of tort, statutes and benefits under Workers' Compensation law and/or vicarious liability arising from employees. Such evidence shall include insurance coverage for Workers' Compensation claims as required by the State of Wisconsin, including Employer's Liability and insurance covering General and Automobile Liability coverage in the following minimum amounts:

Milwaukee County, as its interests may appear, shall be named as an additional insured for General and Automobile Liability, and be afforded a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or non-renewal. A waiver of subrogation for Workers Compensation by endorsement in favor of Milwaukee County shall be provided. Disclosure must be made of any non-standard or restrictive additional insured endorsement, and any use of non-standard or restrictive additional insured endorsement will not be acceptable. A certificate indicating the above coverages shall be submitted for review and approval by the County for the duration of this Agreement.

Coverages shall be placed with an insurance company approved by the State of Wisconsin and rated "A" per Best's Key Rating Guide. Additional information as to policy form, retroactive date, discovery provisions and applicable retentions shall be submitted to County, if requested, to obtain approval of insurance requirements. Any deviations, including use of purchasing groups, risk retention groups, etc., or requests for waiver from the above requirements shall be submitted

in writing to the County for approval prior to the commencement of activities under this Agreement.

The insurance requirements contained within this Agreement are subject to periodic review and adjustment by the County Risk Manager.

11. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall constitute or be construed to create a partnership or joint venture between the County or its successors or assigns and Contractor or its successors or assigns. In entering into this Agreement, and in acting in compliance herewith, Contractor is at all times acting and performing as an independent contractor, duly authorized to perform the acts required of it hereunder.

12. **TERMINATION**:

County or Contractor may terminate this Agreement at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice one party to the other. In the event of termination, the County will only be liable for services rendered through the date of termination and not for the uncompleted portion, or for any materials or services purchased or paid for by Contractor for use in completing the Agreement.

13. SUBCONTRACTS:

Assignment of any portion of the work by subcontract must have the prior written approval of the County.

14. **ASSIGNMENT LIMITATION**:

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their successors and assigns; provided, however, that neither party shall assign its obligation hereunder without the prior written consent of the other.

15. PROHIBITED PRACTICES:

- (a) Contractor, during the period of this Agreement, shall not hire, retain or utilize for compensation any member, officer, or employee of County or any person who, to the knowledge of Contractor, has a conflict of interest.
- (b) Contractor hereby attests that it is familiar with Milwaukee County's Code of Ethics which states, in part, "No person may offer to give to any County officer or employee or his immediate family, and no County officer or employee or his immediate family, may solicit or receive anything of value pursuant to an understanding that such officer's or employee's vote, official actions or judgment would be influenced thereby."

16. NOTICES:

All notices with respect to this Agreement shall be in writing. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, a notice shall be deemed duly given and received upon delivery, if delivered by hand, or three days after posting via US Mail, to the party addressed as follows:

17. **MISCELLANEOUS**:

This Agreement shall be interpreted and enforced under the laws and jurisdiction of the State of Wisconsin. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the parties and is not subject to amendment unless agreed upon in writing by both parties hereto. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that it will perform its obligations hereunder in compliance with all applicable state, local or federal law, rules and regulations and orders.

EXHIBIT A

PROJECT SUMMARY

Milwaukee County Parks, in collaboration with its partners the Milwaukee Conservation Leadership Corps/Student Conservation Association (MCLC/SCA), the Great Lakes Community Conservation Corps (Great Lakes CCC), the Alliance for the Great Lakes (Alliance), and the University of Wisconsin Sea Grant Institute (WISG) seek to improve the health of the Great Lakes ecosystem through an integrative approach to invasive species control. Using the Civilian Conservation Corps model, MCLC/SCA and Great Lakes CCC will work with Milwaukee County Parks to conduct rapid response invasive species removals at 32 ecologically diverse natural areas encompassing 1,300 acres of critical wildlife habitat in one of the Great Lake region's important wildlife migration corridors. In addition, to engage the broader Milwaukee County community, the Alliance will work with students in grades 6 through 12 through experiential learning opportunities and college-aged students through the formation of a network of academic institutions dedicated to the long-term monitoring of these sites. While the Milwaukee County Department of Parks, Recreation & Culture is the lead applicant on this funding request the project is a coalition of organizations working together to implement the larger work plan.

The Milwaukee Conservation Leadership Corps (MCLC) will implement the on the ground invasive species removal projects based on the site-specific control plans developed by the Parks Department's Natural Areas staff. The MCLC will provide internal administrative support for all MCLC activities.

Invasive Species Control

Working in partnership with the Milwaukee County Parks Department, the MCLC will conduct invasive species removal on 28 different invasive species (many of them rapid response populations) found within 32 of the Park System's best natural areas. Invasive species control efforts will follow scientifically and professionally accepted best management practices (BMP's) utilizing control techniques for 28 different invasive plant species which will encompass herbicide application-crew leaders only (foliar and cut-stump), mowing (herbaceous plants), using hand saws and loppers (large woody plants), and bagging plants or seed heads. Invasive species will be controlled during the points in their lifecycles when they are most vulnerable to management techniques.

The invasive species to be controlled will be: black alder, black locust, common buckthorn (select populations in high quality areas), glossy buckthorn, European privet, honeysuckle (Lonicera spp.), Japanese barberry, Japanese knotweed, Norway maple, oriental bittersweet, tree of heaven, wayfaring tree, winged burning bush, common burdock, Canada thistle (select populations in high quality areas), cut-leaved teasel, Dame's rocket, garlic mustard (select populations in high quality areas), lesser celandine, greater celandine, purple loosestrife, spotted knapweed, yellow sweet clover, white sweet clover, wild parsnip, common reed grass, Lyme grass, and reed canary (select populations in high quality areas).

Parks Department Natural Areas staff will also develop a native seed collection program where MCLC crews will assist with harvesting native plant seed for the restoration sites.

Training

MCLC: In the field and classroom sessions on plant identification before and during the field season to ensure proper identification during control efforts and to significantly reduce the chance for collateral damage to native plants and wildlife. Each crew will also undergo day long training sessions in the field with Natural Areas staff to learn proper tool usage and demonstrate use competency before being allowed to work with reduced (weekly site visits vs. daily)Parks Department supervision. Finally, seed collection techniques will be trained in the field under the direct supervision of Parks Department staff to ensure proper seed identification, to prevent over harvest, and to make sure seed will be cleaned and stored properly.
