Supervisor Theodore Lipscomb, Sr., Chairperson 1 From the Committee on Finance, Personnel, and Audit, reporting on: 2 3 4 File No. 15-313 5) A resolution/ordinance by Supervisors Romo West and Dimitrijevic (ITEM 6 amending Section 17.17(3) of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances 7 designating the birthday of Cesar Chavez, March 31st, as a minor holiday for County 8 employees to permit workers to observe this day with service, community, and 9 educational programs in honor of the legacy of the American civil rights and labor 10 movement activist, by recommending adoption of the following: 11 12 A RESOLUTION/ORDINANCE 13 14 WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez was a notable Mexican-American labor organizer and 15 union leader who fought for American civil rights and labor equity; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Mr. Chavez founded the National Farm Worker's Association (later 18 known as the United Farm Workers) in 1962 and drew national attention for his non-19 violent methods of boycotting, marching, and hunger strikes to obtain fair rights for farm 20 21 workers; and 22 23 WHEREAS, after encountering many hurdles and legal conflicts, Mr. Chavez was able to gain recognition for the United Farm Workers in 1970, when California grape 24 growers signed contracts that secured higher wages and improved working conditions 25 for farm laborers in California, Arizona, and Texas; and 26 27 WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez Day is a nationally recognized commemorative 28 29 holiday that is celebrated on March 31st; and 30 WHEREAS, on March 28, 2014, President Barack Obama announced the official 31 proclamation that March 31st shall be known as National Cesar Chavez Day, in which 32 he urged Americans to "observe this day with appropriate service, community, and 33 educational programs to honor Cesar Chavez's enduring legacy"; and 34 35 WHEREAS, although Mr. Chavez's life has been recognized and celebrated 36 within the Latino and labor union communities for many years, it is appropriate for 37 Milwaukee County to take strides to solidify the significant and lasting impact that Mr. 38 Chavez has left behind; now, therefore, 39 40 BE IT RESOLVED, beginning in 2016, March 31st shall be observed as a minor 41 holiday in accordance with Milwaukee County's vacation policy, and County offices, 42 departments, and institutions shall recognize it as such going forward; and 43 44 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Section 17.17(3) of the Milwaukee County Code 45 of General Ordinances shall be amended to reflect the new minor holiday designation 46

so that County employees may observe this day with appropriate service, community, and educational programs to honor Cesar Chavez's enduring legacy by adopting the following:

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AN ORDINANCE

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The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee does ordain as follows:

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SECTION 1. Section 17.17(3) of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is hereby amended as follows:

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17.17. - Vacations and holidays.

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The following days of each year are holidays: January 1, the third Monday in (3)January, the third Monday in February, March 31, the last Monday in May, July 4, November 11, the fourth Thursday in November, December 25, the day appointed by the governor as Labor Day, and the day of holding the general election in November, unless as otherwise may be provided for by collective bargaining agreements; county departments, offices, and institutions may be closed on these holidays: January 1, the third Monday in January, the last Monday in May, July 4, the first Monday in September, the fourth Thursday in November, and December 25. Effective in 2002 the Friday after the fourth Thursday in November shall be a holiday for non-represented employees and employees who are represented by a collective bargaining unit which has agreed to this provision. All county departments, offices and institutions shall be open to the public for business on all other statutory holidays. All employees, including those in the building and mechanical trades group in subsection 17-32(2)(c) [sic], except employees paid on an hourly or per diem basis and firefighter and equipment operators who receive off days in lieu of holidays and assistant chiefs of airport rescue and firefighting who receive off hours in lieu of holidays, shall be granted leave with pay on these days, provided that if an employee is required to work on such days because of the needs of the service, he shall be given equivalent time off or shall receive additional compensation, if such compensation is authorized by the provisions of subsection 17-16(5). Firefighter and equipment operators, who receive seven (7) off days in lieu of all holidays, shall be granted such off days during their first calendar year of employment as provided for in their collective bargaining agreements. Assistant chiefs of airport rescue and firefighting, who receive one hundred nine (109) hours of holiday time in lieu of holidays, shall be granted fifty-four and one-half (54.5) hours, or onehalf (1/2) of the annual allotment, on January 1st of each year and the second half of the annual allotment, fifty-four and one-half (54.5) hours, on August 1st of each year.

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SECTION 2. The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication.

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
