WHEREAS, Section 46.09 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances requires approval from the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors for the purchase of human services from nongovernmental vendors; and

WHEREAS, the Director, Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), is requesting authorization to enter into 2015/2016 Purchase of Service contracts with community organizations for the Management Services Division, DHHS; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County (the County) is contractually required to perform this critical service for its residents year-round, with 24-hour per day access and assistance; and

WHEREAS, based on a 2015 DHHS Request for Proposals, the DHHS Director is recommending Purchase of Service contracts with Community Advocates, Inc., and United Migrant Opportunity Services, Inc., to operate the Energy Assistance Program for the County; and

WHEREAS, each of the recommended contracts that pertain to the Energy Assistance Program is funded with Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP) revenue, and DHHS' ability to execute these contracts will be contingent upon review and approval by the Wisconsin Department of Administration; and

WHEREAS, the 2015-2016 funding for the agency contracts is included in the three-year (Federal Fiscal Year [FFY]16-FFY18) State WHEAP contract; and

WHEREAS, the revenue available to fund these contracts as well as County staff and administrative overhead costs is included in the State WHEAP contract, estimated to be \$2,549,703; and

WHEREAS, the contract recommendations are within limits of relevant 2015 State/County contracts, the 2015 Adopted Budget, and 2016 Requested Budget; and
