# Report on the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and State Awards

We have audited the accompanying Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and State Awards (the "Schedules") of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin (the "County") for the year ended December 31, 2014, and the related notes to the Schedules.

The financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the aggregate discretely presented component units, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2014, which collectively comprise the County of Milwaukee's basic financial statements have been audited and a report dated July 31, 2015 has been issued separately by other auditors.

# Management's Responsibility for the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and **State Awards**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the accompanying Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and State Awards in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. This responsibility includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the Schedules that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

The basic financial statements are the responsibility of the County of Milwaukee's management.

# Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and State Awards based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; the provisions of Office of Management and Budget

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Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations and the provisions of the State Single Audit Guidelines issued by the Wisconsin Department of Administration. Those standards, Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133 and State Single Audit Guidelines, require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and State Awards are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the Schedules. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the Schedules, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the County's preparation and fair presentation of the Schedules in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the County's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the Schedules.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

## **Opinion**

In our opinion, the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and State Awards referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the results of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's operations of Federal and State awards for the year ended December 31, 2014, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

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# INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT ON COMPLIANCE FOR EACH MAJOR FEDERAL AND MAJOR STATE PROGRAM AND REPORT ON INTERNAL **CONTROL OVER COMPLIANCE AS REQUIRED BY OMB CIRCULAR A-133** AND THE STATE OF WISCONSIN SINGLE AUDIT GUIDELINES

To the Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin

## Report on Compliance for Each Major Federal and Major State Program

We have audited the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's compliance with the types of compliance requirements described in the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement and the State of Wisconsin ("State") Single Audit Guidelines that could have a direct and material effect on each of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's major federal and major state programs for the year ended December 31, 2014. The County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's major federal and major state programs are identified in the summary of auditor's results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs.

# **Management's Responsibility**

Management is responsible for compliance with the requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to its federal and state programs.

# Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on compliance for each of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's major federal and major state programs based on our audit of the types of compliance requirements referred to above. We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations and with State Single Audit Guidelines issued by the Wisconsin Department of Administration.

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To the Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin

Those standards, OMB Circular A-133 and the *State of Wisconsin Single Audit Guidelines*, require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal or major state program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal and major state program. However, our audit does not provide a legal determination of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's compliance.

# **Opinion on Each Major Federal and Major State Program**

In our opinion, the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal and major state programs for the year ended December 31, 2014.

# **Other Matters**

The results of our auditing procedures disclosed instances of noncompliance, which are required to be reported in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 or the *State of Wisconsin Single Audit Guidelines* and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2014-1 and 2014-2. Our opinion on each major federal and major state program is not modified with respect to these matters.

## The County of Milwaukee's Responses to Findings

The County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's responses to the noncompliance findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. The County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's responses were not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

# **Report on Internal Control Over Compliance**

Management of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above. In planning and performing our audit of compliance, we considered the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's internal control over compliance with the types of requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each major federal or major state program to determine the auditing procedures that are appropriate

in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on compliance for each major federal and major state program and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 and the *State of Wisconsin Single Audit Guidelines* but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin's internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal or state program on a timely basis.

A material weakness in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal or state program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis.

A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal or state program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

## **Purpose of this Report**

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of OMB Circular A-133 and the *State of Wisconsin Single Audit Guidelines*. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

Independent Auditors' Report

To the Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin

We have audited, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the aggregate discretely presented component units, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin as of and for the year ended December 31, 2014, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the County of Milwaukee's basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated July 31, 2015. Our report includes a reference to other auditors who audited the financial statements of the Milwaukee County War Memorial, Inc., the Marcus Center for the Performing Arts, and the Milwaukee County Research Park Corporation, as described in our report on the County of Milwaukee's financial statements. The financial statements of the Milwaukee Public Museum, Inc., the Milwaukee County War Memorial, Inc., the Milwaukee County Research Park Corporation, Arts, and the Milwaukee County Research for the Performing Arts, and the Milwaukee County Center for the Performing Arts, and *the Milwaukee County Research Park Corporation*, Auditing *Standards*.

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the County of Milwaukee's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the cirmcumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the County of Milwaukee's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the County of Milwaukee's internal control.

A *deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A *material weakness* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A *significant deficiency* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the County of Milwaukee's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the entity's internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this communication is not suitable for any other purpose.

# NOTES TO SCHEDULES OF EXPENDITURES OF FEDERAL AND STATE AWARDS

# FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2014

# 1. SCOPE OF AUDIT

The County of Milwaukee (County) is a governmental entity established by laws of the State of Wisconsin and has the powers of a body corporate, as defined in the Statutes. All significant operations of the County are included in the scope of the Single Audit in accordance with the provisions of the OMB Circular A - 133 and the State Single Audit Guidelines issued by the State of Wisconsin, Department of Administration. The U.S. Department of Transportation has been designated as the County's cognizant agency for the Single Audit.

### (a) **Programs Subject to Single Audit**

All Federal awards received by the County directly from the Federal government or passed through the State of Wisconsin have been included in the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal Awards. All State Awards received by the County have been included in the Schedules of Expenditures of State Awards.

### (b) Fiscal Period Audited

Single Audit testing procedures were performed for program transactions occurring during the calendar year ended December 31, 2014.

### 2. <u>SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES</u>

### (a) Accrued and Deferred Balances

Revenues (which include grantor reimbursement and local funding) are reported on the cash basis of accounting, whereas expenditures are reported on the accrual basis. The difference between the reported revenues and expenditures can result in accrued or deferred balances at the end of the year. These balances are reversed in subsequent periods.

For the Milwaukee County Department of Transportation – Airport Division only:

The 2014 Single Audit Report identifies corrections necessary to the beginning balance reported in 2014 from the ending balance in the 2013 Single Audit Report. Each project contains the 2013 end balance reported in 2013, the adjusted amount for the correction and the correct amount at the start of 2014. As these balances reverse

in subsequent years, making this one-time adjustment brings all the projects in line for the end of 2014.

# (b) Sub grantees

Certain program funds are passed through the County to subgrantee organizations. The Schedules of Expenditures of Awards do not contain separate schedules disclosing how the subgrantees outside of the County's control utilized the funds. The County requires subgrantees receiving funding to submit separate audit reports disclosing the use of program funds.

# (c) <u>Cost Allocation</u>

The County has a plan for allocation of central service costs related to grant programs. The amounts allocated to grant programs during a fiscal year are based on this cost allocation plan. Variances between actual costs and budgeted amounts are corrected on a prospective basis. As a result, the 2014 Cost Allocation Plan was based on the 2012 actual amounts and includes adjustments for variances between the 2012 Plan and the 2012 actual amounts.

In addition to the cost allocation plan, the County has various departments, which provide services to other County departments. Charges between departments are based upon direct rates. The methodology or basis for these direct rates has been reviewed and approved by representatives of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

# 3. **<u>FINDINGS OF NONCOMPLIANCE</u>**

The findings of noncompliance identified in connection with the 2014 Single Audit are disclosed in the section entitled, "Findings of Noncompliance." In determining compliance with the requirements of awards received by the County, samples were selected for testing from the awards shown in the Schedules of Expenditures of Awards. No potential over or under reimbursement effect is shown for internal control findings.

# 4. <u>SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION</u>

(a) Title XIX Medical Assistance payments to the Behavioral Health Division for 2014 and 2013 amounted to \$55,035,088 and \$49,131,008 respectively. These amounts consisted of the following items:

These amounts are unaudited and are presented to satisfy the disclosure requirement by the State of Wisconsin, Department of Health Services, and Division of Health.

- (b) Program income was received mainly in the form of principal and interest payments from home rehabilitation loans to lower-income occupants. The original home repair loans funded by Community Development Block Grants, which originated from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Program income of \$73,700 was received from loans in 2014.
- (c) According to the State of Wisconsin Department of Children and Families, 2014 Youth Aids - State payments for correctional facility charges were \$16,411,405. This amount is unaudited and is presented as additional information to satisfy disclosure requirements established by the State of Wisconsin, Department of Health and Family Services.
- (d) The Milwaukee County Department of Family Care (MCDFC) receives funding from Medicaid through the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS). The funding is through a Medical Assistance (MA) capitated payment rate for Family Care eligible members. Per the State of Wisconsin, the capitated rate funding for MA eligible members is approximately 59.06% from Federal sources and a 40.94% match from the State of Wisconsin. The MCDFC served an average of 8,265 MA Family Care members during 2014 and had 8,397 MA Family Care members as of December 31, 2014 for the eight counties MCDFC services. MCDFC also receives funding from its members' who have responsibility for cost-share and/or room and board if the member resides in a residential health care facility. For 2014 this represented approximately 11.8% of the MCDFC's total revenues.

# 5. **DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY CARE**

As of December 31, 2014 the Milwaukee County Department of Family Care (MCDFC) has met the reserve requirements as identified in its contract with the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS). As required under the contract with DHS to administer the Family Care program, MCDFC shall demonstrate its capacity for financial solvency and stability along with its ability to assume the level of financial risk by maintaining certain reserves. The MCDFC shall maintain a working capital reserve, restricted reserve, and solvency reserve.

# 5. <u>DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY CARE-(CONTINUED)</u>

DHS requires MCDFC to maintain minimum reserve balances for working capital, restricted and solvency reserves separately from Milwaukee County's general fund. Separate bank accounts for the Working Capital and Restricted reserves have been established and the solvency reserve has been pledged and is being held by the Wisconsin Department of Administration. The working capital reserve is required to be funded as a percentage of MCDFC's budgeted net annual capitation revenue. The 2014 minimum working capital reserve requirement of \$7,630,190 was based on 3.0% of net capitation revenue budgeted for 2014 of \$254,339,660. To maintain compliance with working capital reserve requirements under the contract with DHS, the reserve is increased at the end of each year to meet the subsequent year's minimum reserve requirements. If the minimum reserve requirement is determined to be less than what was previously funded, the account balance is not decreased to meet the requirement. The total balance of working capital as of December 31, 2014 is \$27,857,704, with \$7,849,654 deposited in a separate bank account to maintain the minimum requirement. Based on estimated net annual capitation revenue of \$261,583,492 for 2015, the minimum working capital reserve requirement is \$7,847,505. Since the working capital reserve balance exceeds the 2015 minimum requirement, no adjustment was made to the balance as of December 31, 2014.

The restricted reserve is also required to be funded based on a graduated scale using a percentage of net annual capitation revenue. The restricted reserve balance as of December 31, 2014 is \$3,619,913. The 2014 minimum restricted reserve requirement of \$3,543,397 was based on budgeted net capitation revenue for 2014 of \$254,339,660. Similar to the working capital reserve, if the reserve requirement is determined to be less than what was previously funded, the account balance is not decreased to meet the new requirement. Based on the above net capitation revenue projection for 2015, the minimum restricted reserve requirement is \$3,615,835. The account balance at the end of 2014 exceeds the 2015 minimum reserve requirement, so no adjustment was made to the balance as of December 31, 2014.

The solvency reserve minimum requirement is \$750,000, and the funds are required to be pledged to a separate account with the State of Wisconsin Department of Administration. The MCDFC will continue to earn investment income on the funds in this account; however, the funds from this reserve are part of a pooled reserve established for all Managed Care Organizations (MCO's). In November 2014, MCDFC was notified the pooled reserve having all MCO's reserve funds would be partially liquidated to pay for claim run-out and other reasonable expenses of an insolvent MCO. The MCDFC portion of the assessment was \$495,781 and DHS required all MCO's to have their reserve balances replenished by the end of 2014. MCDFC appropriately met this requirement.

Interest earnings on the separate bank accounts for the working capital and restricted reserves were \$14,176 for 2014.

Any annual surplus generated by the MCDFC will be used first to meet reserve requirements, with the excess funds placed into a surplus reserve. The surplus reserve will

be used to cover any future shortfalls in revenues, or to maintain the State minimum reserve requirements. As of December 31, 2014, the Surplus reserve had a balance of \$18,997,010.

### 6. <u>AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT</u>

In February 2009, the Federal government adopted the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) to provide additional federal funding to states and local communities for the purpose of stimulating the economy. All ARRA grants awarded to Milwaukee County in 2014 are identified in the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards in the Award Description. All ARRA revenues recognized in 2014 are identified with a "(2)" in the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards.

# Finding 2013-1

# Award Programs

Community Options Program - COP (435.367)

# **Condition**

During our audit, we noted that for one out of the 24 COP case files tested, the participant transitioned from COP services to Family Care services as of July 1, 2013, but costs continued to be incurred and charged to the COP program through October 2013.

### **Recommendation**

BHD should recover the over payment. BHD should also improve controls over participant files to allow for review of the status of each participant, ensuring that costs are not being incurred for participants who have left the COP program.

# Milwaukee County BHD Response

Milwaukee County has received reimbursement. A letter dated February 13, 2014 was sent to the agency. The over payment reimbursement was received on February 26, 2014, in the amount of \$46,789.20. Milwaukee County holds monthly meetings to review the status of each COP participant to ensure that Individual Recovery Plans are discontinued for participants who have been terminated from the program. In addition, the COP Service Manager will review vouchers for each participant in the COP program on a monthly basis.

### **Current Status**

BHD implemented its corrective action for the COP program. There were no findings for the year ended December 31, 2014. This finding has been satisfactorily cleared.

# Finding 2014-1

# Award Program

Mobile Urgent Treatment Team for Foster Families (MUTT) FF - 437.570022

# **Condition**

During our single audit test work, we noted that for three (3) out of the thirty nine (39) participants selected for testing, BHD did not have a crisis plan or long term crisis plan documented in the participant's case files.

# <u>Criteria</u>

According to the grant agreement between Wisconsin Department of Children and Families and Behavioral Health Division (BHD), the Mobile Urgent Treatment Team for Foster Families (MUTT-FF) will provide to foster families, Treatment Foster Care (TFC) families, court-ordered kinship care providers or youth in assessment centers a written 30-day response plan drawn up by the MUTT-FF team that intervened in the initial crisis situation.

The response plan shall consist of the services and referrals provided or needed to eliminate the child's current and future distress, to de-escalate behavioral problems experienced by the child, and determination whether any follow-up contacts by program staff or linkages with other providers in the community are necessary to help the TFC families, kinship care providers or youth in assessment centers and foster child maintain stable functioning.

The MUTT-FF team in conjunction with Bureau of Milwaukee Child Welfare (BMCW) staff, TFC, kinship care providers and other interested parties will also prepare a long term crisis plan for a child who is found to be at high risk for a recurrent mental health, emotional or behavioral crisis.

### Cause

BHD did not complete a crisis plan or long-term crisis plan for selected participants.

### **Effect**

In the event of a crisis situation, foster families, TFC families, court-ordered kinship care providers or youth in assessment centers may be unable to effectively respond to the situation without a crisis plan.

# **Recommendation**

BHD should ensure that all participants have a documented crisis plan in their case files and available to the MUTT team for crisis situations.

### Management corrective action

Crisis stabilization was put in place as quickly as possible, out of necessity, but there was not enough time to complete the safety plan at the same time. In normal circumstances, the staff gets back to it, but in those three cases, it was overlooked and not completed. We will be taking steps to tighten our monitoring so this problem is corrected and also in order to avoid further reoccurrence. This issue has been discussed and reemphasized with BMCW.

# <u>COUNTY OF MILWAUKEE</u> SUMMARY SCHEDULE OF FINDINGS OF NONCOMPLIANCE

# **Finding 2014-2**

Children's Long Term Support (CLTS) - 435.874

# **Condition**

During our single audit test work, we noted that for seven (7) out of sixty (60) caregivers selected for testing did not have documentation verifying that a background check was performed on caregivers within the last four years as required by the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services Medicaid Waivers Manual Chapter IV, Section 4.05.

# <u>Criteria</u>

Per the Medicaid Waivers Manual, Chapter IV Section 4.05 Page IV-10, County waiver agencies must ensure that unless exempted, all persons working as caregivers, including those who are employed by contract agencies, have had the background checks completed.

# Cause

Disability Service Division (DSD) did not document completed background check performed for the selected caregivers.

# <u>Effect</u>

The standard of care provided to the participant may be compromised due to a failure to screen for unqualified caregivers.

# **Recommendation**

DSD should ensure that all caregivers have background checks that are properly completed and documented before hire as well as every four years thereafter to adhere to the background check policy outlined in the Medicaid Waivers Manual.

### Management corrective action

The Disability Services Division has identified in several instances documentation that potential providers have properly completed background checks every four years and thereafter was not available. The disability services division will work with its contracted providers to ensure the following:

• Background Checks for all existing and potential providers will be managed centrally by the Disability Services Division to ensure compliance with the policy outlined in the Medicaid Waivers Manual.

- Quality Assurance staff will review and monitor the completion of all background checks prior to hiring and every four years thereafter.
- Quality Assurance staff will conduct random audits to confirm that all existing and potential employees have current and valid background checks.
- Prior to all requests for payment authorization, contracted service coordination staff will provide verification that a current and valid background check request is maintained in the child's file every six months.
- Disability Services Division Coordinators will review all requests for new employees and ensure that a valid background check request is submitted and approved prior to approving prior authorizations for payment.
