36 37 38	WHEREAS, based on current bonding authority available and awarded grants Alternative 1 can be funded; and
39 40 41 42	WHEREAS, Alternative 1A is underfunded and DPRC has a US Fish & Wildlife Service grant for fish passage or dam removal pending for \$220,000 leaving \$887,000 required to implement fish passage; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, DPRC has identified two potential 2016 grant opportunities to support fish passage or dam removal and, if awarded, may fully fund that improvement

and if neither grant is awarded, a funding source for fish passage will need to be identified; and

WHEREAS, on-going operation and maintenance costs for dam repair are estimated at \$160,000 per year; and

WHEREAS, the DPRC receives \$51,000 per year from tower rental that has been restricted for use for maintenance and operation of the dam and the remaining \$109,000 per year required remains unfunded and will need to be requested annually through the budget process; and

WHEREAS, the DPRC has finalized the EIS and will be submitting it to the WDNR for their review and the public process required to approve the dam Operational Order and Chapter 31 permit prior to authorizing dam repair; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County will be required to submit a statement of the Board's selection from this action and, if repair is selected, a dam operation plan which includes maintaining a summer impoundment and a partial impoundment for the balance of the year to mitigate environmental impacts to aquatic life; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby selects Alternative \_\_\_ and authorizes inclusion of the alternative and, if repair is chosen, a dam operation plan in the final Environmental Impact Statement to be submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
