(ITEM ) A resolution by Supervisor Mayo, Sr., authorizing the Director, Department of Transportation, in conjunction with the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) to reallocate \$225,000 of the \$1.5 million appropriated from the Capital Improvement Budget to implement Transit Signal Priority along the Wisconsin Avenue Corridor from Downtown Milwaukee to the Medical Complex in Wauwatosa, to conduct or supplement a study related to planning for Bus Rapid Transit for MCTS, by recommending adoption of the following:
A RESOLUTION
WHEREAS, Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) utilizes numerous bus system improvements to yield an ideal level of bus service, which improves the speed, reliability, and accessibility of service; and
WHEREAS, BRT provides potential broader benefits to communities beyond speed and efficiency, such as increased ridership and increased economic development in areas near BRT stations; and
WHEREAS, numerous United States metropolitan areas have introduced BRT or elements of BRT, including Cleveland, Los Angeles, Seattle, and Pittsburgh; and
WHEREAS, Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) are a core feature of BRT as defined by the Federal Transit Administration; and
WHEREAS, Transit Signal Priority is a central strategy of ITS, which uses technology to enable buses to travel faster by extending green lights and shortening red lights at intersections; and
WHEREAS, on July 30, 2015, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors appropriated \$1.5 million to implement Transit Signal Priority along the Wisconsin Avenue corridor from Downtown Milwaukee to the Medical Complex in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin, adopted in File Number 15-526; and
WHEREAS, Milwaukee County Transit System is currently preparing a multi-step process for Transit Signal Priority planning; and
WHEREAS, a September 2015 report from the Director, Department of Transportation, discusses the potential operational and fiscal benefits of developing Transit Signal Priority in tandem with a BRT project from Downtown Milwaukee to the Medical Complex in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Transportation, Public Works, and Transit, at its 47 meeting of December 2, 2015, recommended adoption of the Director's request 48 (vote 7-0); now, therefore, 49

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BE IT RESOLVED, the Director, Department of Transportation, in conjunction 51 with the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) is authorized to use \$225,000 of the 52 53 \$1.5 million appropriated to implement Transit Signal Priority along the Wisconsin 54 Avenue corridor from Downtown Milwaukee to the Medical Complex in Wauwatosa, 55 Wisconsin, to conduct or supplement a study related to planning for Bus Rapid Transit 56 for MCTS.

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
