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(ITEM) A resolution/ordinance by Supervisors Taylor and Weishan, Jr., to amend Chapter 3 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances by directing that any new redistricting plan developed for adoption to re-create the districts for the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors shall be developed by an independent citizen redistricting panel that redraws supervisory districts in the best interest of the citizens of Milwaukee County, by recommending adoption of the following:

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AN AMENDED SUBSTITUTE RESOLUTION/ORDINANCE

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WHEREAS, in accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes, Milwaukee County (the County) is required to redraw its supervisory districts following the Federal Decennial Census; and

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WHEREAS, the next required redistricting process occurs after the 2020 census, and will be undertaken after the 2016, 2018, and 2020 elections; and

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WHEREAS, a growing redistricting reform movement by state and local governmental units seeks to depoliticize the redistricting process all across the country; and

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WHEREAS, examples of this trend of redistricting reform efforts include:

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WHEREAS, several contemporary factors lend themselves to reform the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors redistricting process, including the awareness of the improved redistricting developments elsewhere in the nation; and

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WHEREAS, it is in the interest of good government reform to adopt an ordinance to create an Independent Milwaukee County Redistricting Committee to develop a decennial redistricting plan for the County supervisory districts that is in the best interests of all of the citizens of the County; and

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WHEREAS, the Committee on Judiciary, Safety, and General Services, at its meeting of March 3, 2016, recommended adoption as amended of this resolution (vote 5-1); now, therefore,

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BE IT RESOLVED, that to codify this redistricting policy of establishing an Independent Redistricting Committee, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby amend Chapter 3 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances by adopting the following:

Milwaukee County shall provide an accessible meeting space and sum sufficient funding for the Committee to complete its tasks in a timely manner, including financial support to pay the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) to provide the necessary technical assistance and map drafting services as determined by the IRC to carry out its objective.
126 127 128 129	(e) Compensation. Members of the IRC shall be compensated in the amount \$5,000, or a comparable rate of those who serve on similar public committees. This compensation shall only be offered for services rendered during the time frame in which the decennial redistricting process occurs.

Eighteen (18) supervisory districts are hereafter established as the county supervisory districts for the spring primary in February 2012 and spring election in April 2012 and are to remain in effect until the 2020 federal decennial population census is certified, or unless and until the number of supervisory districts changes. at which time the county board shall thereafter determine the maximum number of county board supervisory districts to be established for the 2024 spring election. A County Board resolution will be submitted in tandem with the certification of the 2020 federal decennial population census and thereafter to adopt the number of supervisory districts established in the recommended map.
140 141 142	(4) Process. The IRC shall be appointed no later than the end of September in the year 2020, 2030, and every decennial period thereafter.
143 144 145 146 147	a. The IRC will convene as soon as practicable after the U.S. decennial census data is prepared and available to the County. The IRC will meet no less than once a month thereafter until a redistricting map is presented to the County Board, no later than May of the year after appointment.

b. Adoption of the map by the County Board shall be by a simple majority of the supervisors then seated. The map and any subsequent drafts proposed by IRC shall be voted on by the County Board.

- c. If the County Board does not adopt the proposed map within thirty (30) days, the map shall return to the IRC for review and redrawing of a second draft, heeding public and elected official comment.
- d. The IRC's second draft of the map, if any, shall be returned to the County Board within twenty (20) days. If the County Board does not adopt the proposed second draft map within ten (10) days, the map shall return to the IRC for review and redrawing of a third draft, heeding public and elected official comment.
- e. The IRC's third draft of the map, if any, shall be returned to the County Board within ten (10) days. If the County Board does not adopt the proposed third draft map within five (5) days, the County Board shall proceed to develop and adopt a map directly, without further IRC consultation, following procedures in Wis. Stat. s. 59.10(2)(a) and related provisions.
- (5) Redistricting for Other Municipalities. Milwaukee County shall offer the same redistricting services to all 19 municipalities, at the expense of the County.
 - a. All municipalities are requested to utilize Milwaukee County's redistricting process and resources to allow for a consistent and uniform model and mapping structure.
 - b. Any municipality that declines to utilize Milwaukee County's redistricting services shall be requested to provide a detailed written report on their individual redistricting process and costs, to include the corresponding maps, population numbers, and demographics as determined by their respective system.
 - <u>c.</u> Municipalities will retain final approval of their respective municipal redistricting maps regardless of which agency's redistricting process and services they utilize.
- (6) Committee Operations. The IRC shall convene and timely complete its work as required by state statute and federal law. Before preparing its first map, the IRC shall hold no fewer than four (4) public hearings for public comment regarding the proposed district maps. No more than two IRC public hearings shall be held in any one municipality.
- (7) Municipality Public Hearing. Any municipality that opts to take advantage of
 Milwaukee County's offer for redistricting services shall be required to hold at least one
 (1) public hearing for public comment regarding the proposed redistricting map. The
 public hearing shall be held at a location within the respective district.
