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10	AN ORDINANCE
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12	The Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:
13	Section 1. Chapter 3 COUNTY BOARD DISTRICTS
14	3.01. Apportionment of county board.
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16	(1) Establishment of Redistricting Authority
17	Independent Redistricting Committee. In order to maintain the integrity of the
18	redistricting process and to mitigate any conflicts of interest or claims of politicization,
19	an Independent Redistricting Committee (IRC) shall be established by this Code and
20	shall be initially convened in accordance with the final published results of the 2020
21	federal decennial census and every census thereafter to develop all subsequent
22	decennial redistricting plans for Milwaukee County.
23	(1)(2) Statement of principles.
24	In order to minimize the differences of population between the eighteen (18) county
25	supervisory districts established by the county board in accordance with the final
26	published results of the 2010 federal decennial census, as distributed by an agency
27	of the state and to comply with s. 59.10(2), [Wis. Stats.]. County supervisory districts
28	are hereafter established so as to represent as nearly as practicable an equal number
29	of persons, but considering such other factors as continuity of interest, compactness
30	of territory and contiguity, and continuity and integrity of existing village and city lines and precincts wherever possible, and with the predominant objective of achieving an
31 32	honest and good faith effort to reduce to the lowest level possible the population
33	differences among all eighteen (18) create the greatest possible equal population
34	distribution among all districts.
35	(a) Committee criteria. The IRC's redistricting plan shall comply with the following
36	criteria:
37	(1) Federal equal population mandates
38	(2) Redistricting criteria established by federal and state laws
39	(3) Maintenance of voting rights of Hispanic and African American and other
40	citizens as guaranteed in the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965.

(4) A map that consists of districts that take into account the integrity of existing 41 neighborhoods and communities of interest within Milwaukee County. 42 (b) Members. The IRC shall be composed of six (6) retired judges, appointed by the 43 County Board Chairperson and confirmed by the County Board, who are residents of 44 familiar with Milwaukee County, and maintain a Wisconsin law license in good standing. 45 appointed by the County Board Chairperson. 46 47 Comment Period for Community Groups. There shall be a comment period of no (c) 48 less than 60 days for specified community groups to submit written feedback regarding 49 the appointees to the County Board Chairperson's office. Milwaukee County shall provide an accessible meeting space and 63 sum sufficient funding for the Committee to complete its tasks in a timely manner, 64 including financial support to pay the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning 65 Commission (SEWRPC) to provide the necessary technical assistance and map 66 drafting services as determined by the IRC to carry out its objective. 67 Compensation. Members of the IRC shall be compensated in the amount \$5,000, 68 or a comparable rate of those who serve on similar public committees. This 69 compensation shall only be offered for services rendered during the time frame in which 70 the decennial redistricting process occurs. 71 (2)(3) Apportionment of supervisory districts. Eighteen (18) supervisory districts are 72 hereafter established as the county supervisory districts for the spring primary in 73 February 2012 and spring election in April 2012 and are to remain in effect until the 74 2020 federal decennial population census is certified, or unless and until the 75 number of supervisory districts changes. at which time the county board shall 76

82		ocess. The IRC shall be appointed no later than the end of September in the year
83	<u>2020,</u>	2030, and every decennial period thereafter.
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85	<u>a.</u>	The IRC will convene as soon as practicable after the U.S. decennial census
86		data is prepared and available to the County. The IRC will meet no less than
87		once a month thereafter until a redistricting map is presented to the County
88		Board, no later than May of the year after appointment.
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90	<u>b.</u>	Adoption of the map by the County Board shall be by a simple majority of the
91		supervisors then seated. The map and any subsequent drafts proposed by IRC
92		shall be voted on by the County Board.
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94	<u>C.</u>	If the County Board does not adopt the proposed map within thirty (30) days, the
95		map shall return to the IRC for review and redrawing of a second draft, heeding
96		public and elected official comment.
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98	<u>d.</u>	The IRC's second draft of the map, if any, shall be returned to the County Board
99		within twenty (20) days. If the County Board does not adopt the proposed
100		second draft map within ten (10) days, the map shall return to the IRC for review
101		and redrawing of a third draft, heeding public and elected official comment.
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103	e.	The IRC's third draft of the map, if any, shall be returned to the County Board
104	_	within ten (10) days. If the County Board does not adopt the proposed third draft
105		map within five (5) days, the County Board shall proceed to develop and adopt a
106		map directly, without further IRC consultation, following procedures in Wis. Stat.
107		s. 59.10(2)(a) and related provisions.
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109	(5) R	edistricting for Other Municipalities. Milwaukee County shall offer the same
110		ricting services to all 19 municipalities, at the expense of the County.
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112		a. All municipalities are requested to utilize Milwaukee County's redistricting
113		committee process and resources to allow for a consistent and uniform
114		model and mapping structure.
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116		b. Any municipality that declines to utilize Milwaukee County's redistricting
117		services shall be requested to provide a detailed written report on their
118		individual redistricting process and costs, to include the corresponding maps,
119		population numbers, and demographics as determined by their respective
120		system.
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122		c. Municipalities will retain final approval of their respective municipal
123		redistricting maps regardless of which agency's redistricting process and
124		services they utilize.

 (6) Committee Operations. The IRC shall convene and timely complete its work as required by state statute and federal law. Before preparing its first map, tThe IRC shall

128	hold no fewer than four (4) public hearings for public comment regarding the proposed
129	district maps. No more than two IRC public hearings shall be held in any one
130	municipality.
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132	(7) Municipality Public Hearing. Any municipality that opts to take advantage of
133	Milwaukee County's offer for redistricting services shall be required to hold at least one
134	(1) public hearing for public comment regarding the proposed redistricting map. The
135	public hearing shall be held at a location within the respective district.
136	Section 2. The provisions of this amended ordinance shall become effective upon
137	passage and publication.
