12 13 14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, the ethics code of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances (the Code) currently requires that candidates for County office file a Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) on the same day that candidates file nomination papers for County elected offices; and
18	WHEREAS, the filing of an SEI on the same day as the filing of nomination
19 20	papers can potentially cause confusion by candidates for office and imposes an onus on such candidates that is collateral to meeting the requirements of the election laws; and

22	WHEREAS, moving the deadline to the Friday after the date for filing nomination
23	papers achieves the policy goal of obtaining the SEI information in a timely manner,
24 25	achieves consistency with deadlines for filings for State office and provides candidates with a reasonable period of time to complete and file an SEI after filing papers to
26 27	become a candidate; and
27	WHEREAS, current Code provisions require incumbent County elected officials
29	to file an SEI with the Election Commission if they are a candidate and then require that
30	such officials file a second SEI with the Ethics Board a few weeks later to satisfy the
31	separate SEI annual filing requirement and such filings are a duplication of effort and
32	redundant; and

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56	(2) Filed with county election commission: Statements of economic interests shall be
57	filed with the county election commission on the Friday following the date of the filing
58	of nomination papers:
59	(a) By all county elected officials when initially a candidate for office; and
60	(b) By all candidates for county elected offices.
61	The election commission shall provide the Ethics Board with a copy of all filings under
62	this paragraph by county elected officials who have filed to be a candidate for office.

64	(3) File within thirty (30) days of employment or taking office: Upon entering county
65	employment, elected office, or appointment as a public official, persons required to
66	file statements of economic interests shall do so within thirty (30) days after
67	commencement of employment or of taking oath of office.

69	(4) Annual statement of economic interest filing requirement:
70	(a) [Requirements.] Each person required to file a statement of economic
71	interests shall file updated statements with the ethics board within thirty (30)
72 73	days after the closing of each calendar year. <u>A filing made by a county</u>
73 74	elected official under section 9.03(2) shall fulfill that year's annual filing requirement.
74 75	(b) Quarterly financial disclosure required for pension board: Each member of the
76	county pension board and each employee of the pension board who is a
77	county official or employee, shall complete and file with the ethics board a
78	quarterly financial disclosure statement no later than the last day of the
79	month following the end of each calendar quarter or any portion thereof in
80	which he or she was a member or employee of the county pension board.
81	Such financial disclosure statements shall be in the form prescribed by the
82	ethics board and shall identify the date and nature of any purchase, sale, put,
83	call, option, lease, or creation, dissolution or modification of any economic
84	interest made during the quarter for which the report is filed and disclosure of
85	which would be required by this code.
86	(c) No compensation until filing: A person required to file a statement of
87	economic interests under this section shall not receive his/her salary or
88	other compensation until he/she files such statement of economic interests.
89	(d) <i>Disclosure by spouse:</i> County elected officials, appointed officials,
90	candidates, and employees required to file statements of economic interests,
91 02	as required by section 9.03, shall include and file statements of a spouse's
92	employment and financial assets and liabilities.
