- SUBJECT: From the Director, Department of Health and Human Services, requesting authorization to create one Community Intervention Specialist position in the Housing Division

### <u>Issue</u>

The Director, Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), is requesting authorization to create one Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) position of Community Intervention Specialist in the Housing Division. The position would support the Housing Division's Housing First Initiative and the County's Plan to End Chronic Homelessness.

### Background

The newly-created position would be responsible for assisting the Division in its homeless outreach efforts as well as linking new Housing First participants with case management services to ensure they are successful in their housing placements. This model has proven successful thus far for the Housing Division has there has not been one eviction to date out of the 145 individuals that have been placed since September 2015. The Housing Division will be stepping up its efforts more during the summer and will have additional rental subsidies available for homeless individuals and families and they will need immediate staff support.

### **Recommendation**

To assist the Housing Division in reaching its goal to end chronic homelessness, DHHS recommends the County Board authorize the Director, Department of Health and Human Services, or his designee, to create the following position:
