1 Supervisor Michael Mayo, Sr., Chairperson, 2 From the Committee on Transportation, Public Works, and Transit, reporting on: 3 4 File No. 16-484 5 6) A resolution by Supervisors Weishan, Jr., Moore Omokunde, Mayo, Sr., (ITEM 7 and Dimitrijevic authorizing the Director of Economic Development, Department of 8 Administrative Services, the Milwaukee County Comptroller, and the Director, Community Business Development Partners, to develop a pilot grant program in the 9 10 amount of \$1,000,000, and a revolving loan program in the amount of \$5,000,000 to 11 provide financial assistance for the replacement of privately-owned lead laterals, as well 12 as the removal of lead paint in owner-occupied homes, residential non-owner occupied 13 homes, and commercial buildings located north of Highland Avenue, south of North 14 Avenue, west of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Drive, and east of 27th Street, by 15 recommending adoption of the following: 16 17 A RESOLUTION 18 19 WHEREAS, both the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Centers 20 for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) agree there is no safe level of lead exposure, 21 as lead is known to cause a range of behavioral and cognitive health problems for 22 humans; and 23 24 WHEREAS, lead can enter drinking water through decay or corrosion of old lead-25 based pipes, fixtures, or from leaded solder that connects water to pipes, and lead can 26 also be found in homes due to lead-based paint and lead-contaminated dust; and 27 28 WHEREAS, in Milwaukee County (the County) the largest concentration of lead 29 pipes are in the City of Milwaukee (the City), with a total of 70,000 lead laterals; and 30 31 WHEREAS, lead paint presents hazards at a high risk for homes built before 32 1978 and very high risk for homes built before 1940, presenting real dangers to 33 residents living in older homes in the City; and 34 35 WHEREAS, the two approaches to prevent lead contamination of water are 36 water treatment or pipe replacement; and 37 38 WHEREAS, the treatment approach treats water with chemicals, such as 39 phosphorus to control corrosion, which minimizes lead levels to EPA permissible levels 40 but does not remove the source of lead; and 41 42 WHEREAS, the replacement approach, which replaces all or a portion of the

plumbing infrastructure with non-lead pipes and fixtures, can eliminate lead in the water

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system; and

 WHEREAS, ownership of lead lateral service lines is shared between the municipality and the homeowner, as the municipality is responsible for the portion from the water main to the property line, and the homeowner is responsible for the portion from the property line to the home; and

WHEREAS, national research indicates that the potential risk for increased lead levels is greater when there is only a partial replacement of a lead service line; and

WHEREAS, full replacement is desirable but costly for homeowners, as the City estimates it will cost homeowners between \$3,500-\$7,000 to replace their portion of the lead lateral; and

WHEREAS, when the City of Madison replaced the vast majority of privately owned lead laterals, replacement was partially paid for through general purpose tax dollars, as well as through grants provided by the utility; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of lead in the water-system and in homes is important to the health and safety of County residents; and

WHEREAS, the County has an obligation address the threat of lead contamination and assist homeowners in eliminating this threat; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Transportation, Public Works, and Transit, at its meeting of September 7, 2016, recommended adoption of this resolution (vote 4-1); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) requests the Director of Economic Development, Department of Administrative Services (DAS), the Milwaukee County Comptroller, and the Director, Community Business Development Partners (CBDP), develop a pilot grant program in the amount of \$1,000,000 subject to the review and approval of the County Board, to provide financial assistance to homeowners for the replacement of privately owned lead laterals and removal of lead paint from their homes located north of Highland Avenue, south of North Avenue, west of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Drive, and east of 27th Street; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board requests the Director of Economic Development, DAS, the Milwaukee County Comptroller, and the Director, CBDP, develop a revolving loan program in the amount of \$5,000,000 subject to the review and approval of the County Board, to provide financial assistance for the replacement of lead laterals and the removal of lead paint on commercial properties or residential non-owner occupied homes located north of Highland Avenue, south of North Avenue, west of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Drive, and east of 27th Street; and
