22	WHEREAS, Section 60.01 of the Milwaukee County Code of General
23	Ordinances (the Code) sets a specific fee for physicians at \$100 for an
24 25	examination, and \$100 for testimony; and
26	WHEREAS, in the Code, the following pay scale applies to psychologists:
27 28	\$70 per examination, and \$70 for testimony; and
29 30	WHEREAS, the courts have found it increasingly difficult to find qualified experts willing to serve in mental commitment cases at these rates; and
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32 33 34 25	WHEREAS, in all other types of court cases, fees for court-appointed experts, such as physicians, psychologists, attorneys, etc., are set by the courts; and

66	Licensed physicians specializing in psychiatry; licensed physicians and licensed
67	psychologists examining persons alleged to be mentally ill, drug dependent,
68 69	alcoholics or developmentally disabled, shall be paid the following fees:
70	-(1) For examinations. For examinations and certificates by a licensed
71	psychiatrist, including clinical interviews, where such examination is made in or
72	outside the examiner's office, and all allowance for travel, one hundred dollars
