 - A. The 2016 transit budget included a trial extension of bus Route 51. After six months of the route being in service, it is considered too inefficient to continue. Meanwhile, MCTS received requests for an extension of the PurpleLine route. MCTS seeks to cancel the Route 51 extension and implement an extension of the PurpleLine route.
 - B. The changes would go into effect in March 2017 at which time the bus hours budgeted for the failed Route 51 extension would be moved to support the extension of the PurpleLine route.
 - C. The changes would go into effect in March 2017. Discontinuing Route 51 and adding a PurpleLine extension is not expected to result in a fiscal impact.
