Fiscal 2017 – Quarter 1 Financial update (for the year ending August 31, 2017)

Summary

The mission of the Milwaukee Art Museum, Inc. (Art Museum) is to serve the community and present art as a vital source of inspiration and education. The Art Museum is committed to bring people together to inform, educate and engage in conversation around art through our collection, exhibition and programs.

For the quarter ended November 30, 2016, the Art Museum presented the following major exhibitions, Haunted Screens: German Cinema in the 1920s (closed January 22, 2017), Nature and Opulence: The Art of Martin Johnson Heade (open until February 26, 2017), The Lives of Others and Rineke Dijkstra: Rehearsals (closed January 1, 2017). Attendance was 7% below plan for the first quarter ended November 30, 2016; ending at just under 48,000 visitors, with approximately 54% coming from Milwaukee County. School tours welcomed almost 3,900 students to the Art Museum for the year with over 54% of school students from Milwaukee County.

Financial results

Attached are the financial results for the first quarter ended November 30, 2016. The Art Museum contributed revenue accounted for over 52% of all revenue sources. The earned revenue was 37% of total revenue. The remaining 11% of revenue was primarily due to the distribution to operations from the endowment fund.

Looking forward

The Milwaukee Art Museum has recently changed its late night hours to Thursday evenings. The Meijer Free day will also be the first Thursday of the month beginning in February. The Art Museum's current exhibitions are Nature and Opulence: The Art of Martin Johnson Heade (open until February 26, 2017), Lawrence Weiner: Inherent Innate Tension (open until April 2nd). Future exhibitions include: Milwaukee Collects (opens March 10, 2017), Helen Levitt: In the Street (opens January 27, 2017), Eastman Johnson in Focus (opens February 11, 2017) and How Posters Work (opens on April 1, 2017).

Regarding the O'Donnell property, Museum and County legal counsel are in the process of reviewing documents and making good progress. Survey work is in progress and is critical to the finalization of the transaction. MAM has completed due diligence as specified in the approved term sheet.
