Fiscal 2017 – Quarter 2 Financial update (for the year ending August 31, 2017)

Summary

The mission of the Milwaukee Art Museum, Inc. (Art Museum) is to serve the community and present art as a vital source of inspiration and education. The Art Museum is committed to bring people together to inform, educate and engage in conversation around art through our collection, exhibition and programs.

For the quarter ended February 28, 2017, the Art Museum presented the following major exhibitions, Haunted Screens: German Cinema in the 1920s (closed January 22, 2017), Nature and Opulence: The Art of Martin Johnson Heade (closed February 26, 2017), The Lives of Others and Rineke Dijkstra: Rehearsals (closed January 1, 2017), and Ralston Crawford: Art is for Everyday (closed January 29, 2017). Attendance was 16% below plan for the six months ended February 28, 2017; ending at just over 136,000 visitors, with approximately 59% coming from Milwaukee County. School tours welcomed 22,500 students to the Art Museum for the year with over 60% of school students from Milwaukee County.

Financial results

Attached are the financial results for the six months ended February 28, 2017. The Art Museum contributed revenue accounted for over 59% of all revenue sources. The earned revenue was 30% of total revenue. The remaining 11% of revenue was primarily due to the distribution to operations from the endowment fund.

Looking forward

The Milwaukee Art Museum has recently changed its late night hours to Thursday evenings. The Meijer Free day is the first Thursday of each month. The Art Museum's current exhibitions are Lawrence Weiner: Inherent Innate Tension (open until April 2, 2017), Milwaukee Collects (open until May 21, 2017), How Posters Work (open until June 25, 2017) Helen Levitt: In the Street (open until April 16, 2017), James Nares: In the City (open until April 16, 2017), Eastman Johnson and a Nation Divided (open May 21, 2017) and How Posters Work (open until June 25, 2017). Upcoming future Exhibits at the museum are Paul Druecke: A Social Event Archive (opens on May 12, 2017) and Frank Lloyd Wright: Buildings for the Prairie (opens July 28, 2017).

Regarding the O'Donnell property, Museum and County legal counsel are in the process of reviewing documents and making good progress. Survey work is in progress and is critical to the finalization of the transaction. MAM has completed due diligence as specified in the approved term sheet.
