What is the Greenway?
The Milwaukee River of trails and greenspace along the Milwaukee and River within the City of Milwaukee and nearby suburbs.

There are currently over 28 miles of hiking, and water trails along six miles of biking, and water trails along six miles of existing public easements on private land. Seventy percent of the land is owned by Milwaukee County Parks.
