1 File No. 17-601 2 3 A resolution by Supervisor Alexander, creating a policy to replace the terms "juvenile" 4 and "delinquent" with the terms "youth" or "children" to better reflect the mission, vision, 5 and values of Milwaukee County, by recommending adoption of the following: 6 AN AMENDED RESOLUTION 7 8 9 WHEREAS, it is becoming a preferred trauma-informed practice to cease 10 deliberate institutional use of the words "juvenile" and "delinquent" as descriptors of 11 children in the youth justice system, as evidenced by the actions of the Federal 12 government and the State of Wisconsin (the State); and 13 14 WHEREAS, the need for trauma-informed care in the youth justice system is unquestionable when one considers that 90 percent of youth in the system report 15 exposure to a traumatic event and 30 percent of those youth meet criteria for Post-16 17 Traumatic Stress Disorder, per the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court 18 Judges; and 19 20 WHEREAS, beginning in 2015, the United States government moved away from the term "juvenile delinquent" when the Attorney General issued a press release 21 22 utilizing the term "justice-involved youth" instead; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Federal departments such as the Department of Justice, 25 Department of Education, and the Department of Housing and Urban Development use 26 the term "justice-involved youth"; and 27 28 WHEREAS, many other organizations including the National Child Traumatic 29 Stress Network, the Illinois State Board of Education, the National Center on Criminal 30 Justice and Disability, the California Social Work Education Center, and others have 31 also transitioned to using the term "justice-involved youth"; and 32 33 WHEREAS, the State Department of Children and Families (DCF) is also shifting 34 away from the term "juvenile", in recognition that the term "youth justice" more 35 accurately reflects its mission of supporting children and youth; and 36 37 WHEREAS, according to DCF, the idea for the language switch came from the 38 youth themselves and, is strongly supported by counties throughout the State; and 39 40 WHEREAS, as youth put it, "nothing good ever comes from a juvenile" – a 41 profound statement that summarizes the assumptions and negative connotations 42 inherent in the terms "juvenile" and "delinguent"; and 43

44 45 WHEREAS, the State's First Lady has partnered with the DCF and various private organizations on the "Fostering Futures Initiative," aimed at helping the State to 46 47 better recognize and understand the effects of trauma on the lives of children and 48 families in the State: and 49 50 WHEREAS, Milwaukee County (the County) seeks to honor each person's 51 inherent value as an individual, each person's right to be valued, the opportunities that 52 each child and family have to chart a better course for their life, and recognizes that a 53 child's actions need not forever define who they are and who they will become; and 54 WHEREAS, in furthering the vision, mission, and goals of the County, it is 55 imperative to replace the negative labels of "juvenile" and "delinguent" with a term that 56 57 better reflects the goals and outcomes that the County strives to achieve for youth in its 58 justice system; and 59 60 WHEREAS, the Committee on Health and Human Needs, at its meeting of September 20, 2017, recommended adoption of File No. 17-601 as amended 61 62 (vote 4-0); now, therefore, 63 64 BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) supports Milwaukee County (the County) youth involved in the justice system by 65 66 creating a policy to remove from the County's institutional lexicon the negative labels "juvenile" and "delinguent" as terms used to describe children, and replace them with 67 "children" and "youth" to better reflect the vision, mission, and goals of the County 68 69 justice system; and 70 71 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing in this policy will restrict the County 72 from using the terms "juvenile" or "delinquent" for reasons of clarity, compliance, or any 73 other reason necessary to comply with Wisconsin State law; and 74 75 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes and 76 requests that the Department of Administrative Service (DAS) modify the name of the 77 Vel R. Phillips Juvenile Justice Center to the Vel R. Phillips Youth and Family Justice 78 Center in recognition of this policy change; and 79 80 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes and requests that DAS modify the name of the Vel R. Phillips Juvenile Detention Center to 81 82 the Vel R. Phillips Youth Detention Center in recognition of this policy change; and 83 84 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Department of Health and Human Services is 85 hereby authorized and requested to change the name of the Delinguency and Court 86 Services Division to the Division of Youth and Family Services to better reflect the 87 mission of the County in serving youth in the justice system; and 88

- 89 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Clerk shall forward this resolution to 90 all County Departments to ensure timely notice of this policy.
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
