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11	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County departments enter into numerous professional
12	service agreements each year with vendors to provide services on behalf of Milwaukee
13 14	County taxpayers; and
15	WHEREAS, based on past audits performed by the Audit Services Division of
16 17	the Office of the Comptroller, outside vendor contract performance is often poorly monitored and, in a few high-profile cases, has led to significant legal problems for the
18 19	County; and
20	WHEREAS, in 1980 the United States Department of Transportation, under the
21 22	authority of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, created the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program to counter and rectify contemporary and past discriminatory
23 24	ills toward women and persons of color; and
25	WHEREAS, DBE program regulation is established in 49 CFR Part 23 and 49
26 27	CFR Part 26 for recipients of federal DOT funds and airport concessionaires, respectively, to fulfill the objectives of:

31	• Allowing emerging DBE companies to gain a foothold in the economy, grow, and

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36	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County maintains a Diversity Management and
37	Compliance System (B2GNow) managed by the Community Business Development
38 20	Partners which oversees the County's DBEs and Targeted Business Enterprises
39 40	(TBEs); and
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41 WHEREAS, on May 30, 2017, policymakers requested the Director of 42 Community Business Development Partners provide written bi-monthly reports to the 43 Committees on Transportation, Public Works, and Transit and Economic and 44 Community Development on DBE participation and DBE participation waivers (File No. 45 17-403); and 46 47 WHEREAS, at its meeting on September 10, 2018, the Committee on Economic 48 and Community Development reviewed File No. 18-674, in which the Director of 49 Community Business Development Partners reported the Milwaukee County Transit 50 System (MCTS) contract with a Milwaukee marketing firm was at-risk of not meeting its 51 pledged DBE goals; and 52 53 WHEREAS, specifically, the marketing firm is two and a half years into a three-54 year contract and has only subcontracted 1.7% of its contract to the DBE firms in its 55 agreement while the pledged goal is 20%; and 56 57 WHEREAS, the Committees on Economic and Community Development and 58 Transportation, Public Works, and Transit receive regular bi-monthly and annual reports 59 on DBE/TBE participation and submissions to the Federal Transit Administration, but 60 does not receive reconciliations on how well contractors perform in fulfillment of their 61 DBE/TBE goal pledges; and 62 63 WHEREAS, Milwaukee County has observed and been frustrated for years by 64 prime contractors who have not made good faith efforts to fulfill their contractual 65 DBE/TBE obligations with the Milwaukee County and DBE/TBE businesses who were 66 led to believe they would be included; now, therefore, 67 68 BE IT RESOLVED, Milwaukee County requests the Director of Community 69 **Business Development Partners:** 70 71 • Continue monitoring the MCTS contract with the local marketing firm and provide 72 monthly updates to the Committee on Economic and Community Development 73 ("Committee") on the firm's DBE pledge 74 75 Meet with several other DBE/TBE subcontractors who have not been receiving 76 the level of work promised by prime contractors in their bids, to solicit feedback 77 and generate ideas for improving Milwaukee County's DBE/TBE program 78 79 Study and present a written report to the Committee outlining recommendations 80 on how Milwaukee County might improve its DBE/TBE goal monitoring, 81 reporting, and options to best structure penalties for prime contractor
