12 13 14	WHEREAS, Columbus Park (the Park) is located between North 72 nd and North 74 th Streets, and West Courtland and West Glendale Avenues in Milwaukee; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, on September 28, 1956, the Park was named for Christopher Columbus by the Milwaukee County (the County) Park Commission; and
17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, the history of the settling of the United States, and the role that Christopher Columbus played, is contentious and frequently ignores the displacement and suffering of Indigenous peoples; and
22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, Indigenous peoples were forced to relinquish their land in the early 1800s by settlers to expand West, and were either forced onto reservations in isolation, or made to assimilate with colonizing groups; and
26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, the County is home to several Indigenous groups, including the Menominee, Fox, Mascouten, Sauk, Potawatomi, Ojibwe, and Ho-Chunk tribes, along with the many tribes that live throughout the State of Wisconsin; and
30 31 32 33	WHEREAS, the largest Native American population in Wisconsin, the Menominee, was pressured to sell away 11,600 square miles of land along the lower Fox River; and
34 35 36	WHEREAS, other tribes, including the Sauk and Fox tribes, were forced to cede their land claims in southern Wisconsin; and
37 38 39 40	WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution on December 15, 2016, (File No. 16-698), declaring the second Monday of October as Indigenous People's Day; and
41 42	WHEREAS, the naming of a park often reflects significant individuals and contributions to the community; and
43 44 45 46	WHEREAS, changing the name of the Park to Indigenous People's Park is a meaningful way to honor the contributions of Indigenous groups throughout the County; and

47 48 WHEREAS, the Committee on Parks, Energy, and Environment, at its meeting of 49 January 29, 2019, recommended adoption of File No. 19-101 (vote 3-0); now, therefore, 50 51 BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby directs 52 the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Culture (DPRC) to change the name of 53 Columbus Park to Indigenous Peoples' Park; and 54 55 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the DPRC is authorized to perform any steps 56 necessary to implement the change: and 57 58 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Department of Administrative Services is 59 authorized and directed to process an appropriation transfer in the amount of \$9,700 60 from Org. 1800-1945 – Appropriation for Contingencies, to an appropriate account 61 within Org. 9000 – DPRC, to offset the anticipated costs of updating the signage at the 62 park to reflect the new name. 63 64 65 66 67 kae 01/29/19
