12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, in 2018, with support from the Procurement Division, Department of Administrative Services (DAS), the House of Correction (HOC), and Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a Correctional Medical Services provider for a new contract for health care services in the Milwaukee County (the County) Jail and HOC, beginning in 2019 (RFP 98180020: Correctional Medical Services); and
20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, additional detail regarding the RFP was provided to the Committee on Judiciary, Safety, and General Services, in the October 18, 2018, and November 16, 2018, informational reports, and to the Committee on Finance and Audit in the December 6, 2018, informational report; and
24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, during the process of researching and drafting the RFP, the County became aware that contract monitoring provided by an independent third party capable of both fiscal and clinical oversight, was key to success of any contracted health care service; and
29 30 31 32 33 34	WHEREAS, as a result, with support from the Procurement Division, DAS, the HOC and County Sheriff's Office issued a RFP for a Contract Monitor to provide fiscal and clinical oversight of any current or future health services contract (RFP 98180024: Correctional Medical Services Contract Monitor); and
35	WHEREAS, the RFP was issued on September 21, 2018; and
36 37 28	WHEREAS, the RFP closed for submissions on October 26 th , 2018; and
38 39 40 41 42 43	WHEREAS, following evaluation by an Evaluation Committee comprised of medical, legal, risk, and fiscal professionals, the Evaluation Committee recommended award of the RFP to National Commission on Correctional Health Care Resources, Inc. (NRI); and,

44 WHEREAS; NRI, a non-profit subsidiary of the NCCHC, provides technical 45 consulting services for correctional health care systems nationwide, and its subcontractors and agents represent a wide variety of experts in the correctional health 46 47 field, including clinicians, educators, administrators, and other thought leaders, and as a 48 subsidiary of NCCHC, NRI is uniquely positioned to audit and monitor correctional 49 health care and correctional health care contracts; and 50 51 WHEREAS, the County has worked previously with NRI's Chief Health Officer, 52 Dr. Brent Gibson, and his team in the development of the RFP, and with other small 53 projects pertaining to correctional health care; and 54 55 WHEREAS, when the County became aware that a limited extension with Armor 56 Correctional would be necessary to ensure uninterrupted provision of patient care, the 57 County requested that NRI step in to provide contract monitoring for the remainder of 58 the contract; and 59 60 WHEREAS, NRI was able to provide the services for under \$100,000, and a 61 contract was drafted in December 2018; and 62 63 WHEREAS, that contract is out for signature at the time of drafting of this report, 64 and is expected to be executed before January 16, 2019, at which time NRI will begin to 65 provide contract monitoring services of the Armor contract; and 66 67 WHEREAS, Dr. Gibson and NRI have demonstrated passion and dedication to 68 the improvement of care outcomes for inmate patient populations, and have 69 demonstrated their incredible value to the County throughout the RFP process and 70 through our other partnerships; and 71 72 WHEREAS, their ongoing assistance is of monumental benefit to the County in 73 improving our provision of health care to our inmate patient population, regardless of the 74 ultimate direction taken by the County in providing that care; and 75 76 WHEREAS, the contract awarded is for a period of one year, with no more than 77 four optional one-year renewals; and 78 79 WHEREAS, the total cost of these services in year one is \$373,188; and 80 81 WHEREAS, this cost is inclusive of the following: a lead contract monitor at 42 82 hours per month; a medical contract monitor at 17 hours per month; a fiscal contract 83 monitor at 17 hours per month; transition support; back-office support; and other 84 expenses; and 85 86 WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance and Audit, at its meeting of February 1, 87 2019, reaffirmed the adopted policy to pursue insourcing of inmate medical services, and by approving a two-year contract with Wellpath, LLC, provided enough time for the 88

89 County and its consultants to complete the thorough analysis and careful planning 90 required to directly provide these services; and 91 92 WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance and Audit, at its meeting of February 1, 93 2019 recommended adoption of File No. 19-196 as amended (vote 5-0); now, therefore, 94 95 BE IT RESOLVED, the Superintendent, House of Correction (HOC), is hereby 96 authorized to enter into a Professional Services Agreement with National Commission 97 on Correctional Health Care Resources, Inc., (NRI) in the amount of \$373,188 for fiscal and medical monitoring services of any contract with any vendor providing inmate 98 health care services in the Milwaukee County Jail or HOC for a one-year term effective 99 100 April 1, 2019, through March 30, 2020; and 101 102 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the contract award includes four one-year 103 renewal options. 104 105 106 107 108 srb 02/01/19

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
