
MCTS System Today

40/60

40% - High Frequency Service

60% - Low Frequency Service

In the 1990s,
MCTS operated 70%
High Frequency service.





Background / Progress

County Board authorizes route redesign study

MCTS NEXT introduced to the County Board

MCTS develops 60/40 & 80/20 proposals. Public and stakeholders comment on proposals






MCTS NEXT – Option 1

60/40

- 6 new High Frequency routes (16 total)
- Improved weekend frequency
- 15 Local routes / 8 Daytime routes (service 6 AM – 7 PM)

97% of riders' service is retained







MCTS NEXT – Option 2

80/20

- 10 new High Frequency routes (20 total)
- Improved weekend frequency
- 11 Local routes
- No Daytime routes

95% of riders' service is retained







Outreach Plan - Goals

- Give riders a voice on what they want transit routes to look like
- Give rider's multiple opportunities to provide feedback

• Be **inclusive** of all riders

Host meetings across Milwaukee County





Outreach Plan - Opportunities

- 3 public meetings
 - 125 attendees
- Spanish Language Open House
 - 50 attendees
- Virtual Open House
 - 900 unique views
- MCTS NEXT Survey
 - 700 responses





- Solid Support for MCTS NEXT
 - 75% supported either or both proposed plans



78% said proposed plans were easy to understand



79% said proposed plans connected major places



 70% said proposed plans would allow me to ride more often






- 70% of respondents want
 more frequent / faster service
- 77% of respondents are willing to walk 1 to 3 blocks farther to get to a high frequency route
- 30% of respondents want service extended to unserved areas

97% of riders willcontinue to be ableto board at theirbus stop or within afew minutes walk



- More support for 60/40 proposal than 80/20 proposal
- Support for retaining service in some corridors proposed to be eliminated
- Support for expanding daytime service to all day service in some corridors





- Top preferences for **new high frequency** service
 - 76th Street
 - Oklahoma Avenue
 - Humboldt Boulevard



- Top preferences for maintaining service or adding new service
 - Wilson Drive Santa Monica
 - Miller Park Way
 - Port Washington Road
 - Howell Avenue (Oak Creek)





Outreach Efforts - Stakeholders









































Here's what stakeholders told us...

- Solid Support for MCTS NEXT
 - More high frequency has been met with good support across all stakeholder groups
 - More support for 60/40 proposal across all stakeholder groups because of expanded coverage
 - Great support to simply the system which will attract more riders



Here's what stakeholders told us...

- Concerns Regarding MCTS NEXT
 - Concern about additional walking to bus stops due to bus stop optimization (especially in winter)
 - Concern that daytime routes would not meet the evening service hours of businesses/institutions along the route
 - Concern about connections to outlying job centers, including those outside of Milwaukee County
