AN AMENDED RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin (the State) requires United States (U.S.) citizenship or legal residence to obtain a State identification card or driver's license; and

WHEREAS, in today's society, many communities lack adequate public transportation, creating barriers for people to attend to their basic needs, including:

- Commuting to work
- Taking children to school
- Shopping for food, clothes, and other necessities
- Going to clinics and hospitals for medical visits
- Visiting places of worship

; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Census Bureau reported in the 2017 American Community Survey that approximately 85 percent of Milwaukee County residents regularly drove to work; and

WHEREAS, Kids Forward, formerly the Wisconsin Council on Children and Families, reports in the November 2018 Wisconsin Budget Project document, "Widen the Road: Removing Barriers to Driver License Eligibility Will Improve Safety, Support Families, and Boost Businesses," that removing State restrictions regarding driving licensure would:

 Facilitate undocumented immigrants driving further to reach more distant employment locales

 Improve overall driver safety by allowing undocumented immigrants to undergo the requisite tests to obtain a license

 Lower insurance premiums statewide, by approximately \$16 million, via enlarging the pool of insured persons by approximately 28,000

 • Raise an additional \$2 million toward State transportation objectives from the annual vehicle registration fee
