From the Director, Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), requesting authorization to transfer up to \$500,000 of its projected 2018 operating surplus to Capital Project WS12401-Secured Youth Facility Phase I, for planning and design of a Secured Residential Care Center for Children and Youth, by recommending adoption of the following:

## **A RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, over the past few years, the County Executive and the Milwaukee County Board Supervisors (County Board) have been working with key stakeholders to address the crisis at Lincoln Hills and Copper Lake and have embraced policies surrounding the creation of a local alternative option for Milwaukee County (the County) youth to be placed in a safe environment that is closer to home; and

WHEREAS, in March 2018, the Wisconsin State Legislature adopted Act 185 (the Act), which directs the closure of Lincoln Hills and Copper Lake for use as youth correctional facilities by January 1, 2021, with counties assuming responsibility for operating Secured Residential Care Centers for Children and Youth (SRCCCYs); and

WHEREAS, under the Act, the State Building Commission can authorize up to \$40 million to counties for the planning and construction of these facilities and eligible construction costs include new construction, as well as the renovation of an existing structure; and

WHEREAS, to qualify for the funds, counties must submit grant applications to the Juvenile Corrections Grant Committee in the Wisconsin Department of Corrections by March 31, 2019, covering the following types of facilities:

95 percent of the design and construction costs of a SRCCCY

secure, local alternative for County youth; and

  95 percent of the design and construction costs of a facility housing both a SRCCCY and a youth detention facility

  100 percent of the design and construction costs of a SRCCCY or a portion of a SRCCCY for female youth only

; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Youth and Family Services (DYFS), Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), has assembled a Steering Committee and workgroups to formulate recommendations and options for the development of a

WHEREAS, under Section 938.34(4m), Wisconsin State Statutes, the mission of the project is to establish a safe, positive, sustainable, and developmentally appropriate treatment environment for youth committed to the county that effectively promotes accountability, protects the community, reduces recidivism, and returns youth to our community with the skills needed to become successful and productive citizens; and

WHEREAS, in September 2018, the County Board adopted File No. 18-633 authorizing the creation of Capital Project WS12401 - Secured Youth Facility Phase 1 with a budget of \$3 million to support the initial planning and design as well as cover the five percent contribution toward the overall project; and

WHEREAS, DHHS is anticipating a total department-wide tax levy surplus of about \$1.2 million as reported in its December 2018 fiscal report, and a portion of this surplus is being generated within DYFS due to the delay in opening the Bakari House Residential Care Center; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Health and Human Needs, at its meeting of March 13, 2019, recommended adoption of File No. 19-235 (vote 5-0) and;

WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance and Audit, at its meeting of March 14, 2019, recommended adoption of File No. 19-235 (vote 5-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director, Department of Health and Human Services, or her designee, to transfer up to \$500,000 of its projected 2018 tax levy surplus to Capital Project WS12401 - Secured Youth Facility Phase 1; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Office of the Comptroller, and the Office of Performance, Strategy, and Budget, Department of Administrative Services, are authorized and directed to transfer up to \$500,000 in tax levy surplus from Org. Unit 8000 - Department of Health and Human Services to Capital Project WS12401-Secured Youth Facility Phase 1.
